A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to clarify the
2 legislature's intent that no person who has failed to receive
3 the advice and consent of the senate shall continue in office as
4 a holdover member.

5 SECTION 2. Section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

7 "(a) The members of each board and commission established
8 by law shall be nominated and, by and with the advice and
9 consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. Unless
10 otherwise provided by this chapter or by law hereafter enacted,
11 the terms of the members shall be for four years; provided that
12 the governor may reduce the terms of those initially appointed
13 so as to provide, as nearly as can be, for the expiration of an
14 equal number of terms at intervals of one year for each board
15 and commission. Unless otherwise provided by law, each term
16 shall commence on July 1 and expire on June 30, except that the
17 terms of the chairpersons of the board of agriculture, the board
18 of land and natural resources, and the Hawaiian homes commission

Restricts members of boards and commissions who have been reappointed to a second consecutive term and whose reappointment has failed to receive the consent of the senate from serving as a holdover member.
