# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE USE OF HAWAII-BASED UNION CONTRACTORS AND WORKERS FOR  
STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY CONSTRUCTION OR RENOVATION  
PROJECTS.

1           WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is obligated to operate a  
2 system of correctional facilities to house those members of  
3 society who have been convicted of crimes and must be  
4 incarcerated for potential rehabilitation and to ensure the  
5 safety of society; and  
6

7           WHEREAS, the State's correctional facilities are in need of  
8 repair and expansion; and  
9

10           WHEREAS, most correctional facilities have reached or  
11 exceeded their maximum prisoner capacities, and the State has  
12 contracted with facilities in other states to hold Hawaii  
13 inmates; and  
14

15           WHEREAS, the State needs to construct additional  
16 correctional facilities to hold Hawaii inmates who are currently  
17 held in other states; and  
18

19           WHEREAS, state officials have indicated a desire to bring  
20 Hawaii inmates held in other states back to Hawaii; and  
21

22           WHEREAS, the Governor has indicated that the State is  
23 seeking public-private partnerships to build additional  
24 correctional facilities; and  
25

26           WHEREAS, the construction of any new correctional facility  
27 on state land must comply with state procurement and contracting  
28 laws and other state requirements; now, therefore,

30           BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-seventh  
31 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, the

1 House of Representatives concurring, that for the construction  
2 or renovation of any correctional facility in Hawaii, the state  
3 administration is urged to require:

- 5 (1) Compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act;

  - 7 (2) That all workers involved in the project be domiciled  
8 in the State of Hawaii; and
  - 9
  - 10 (3) That all general contractors and subcontractors  
11 involved in the project sign a project labor agreement  
12 with general and specialty craft unions; and

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
15 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the  
16 Director of Public Safety.
