# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING AND HONORING THE LATE HAWAII DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH  
DIRECTOR LORETTA JEAN DELIANA ANTONE FUDDY, ACSW, MPH, FOR  
PROMOTING THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING OF THE PEOPLE OF  
HAWAII.

1           WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii takes pride in recognizing and  
2 honoring the notable contributions of exceptional individuals in  
3 our community who seek to promote the health and well-being of  
4 the people in our communities; and

6           WHEREAS, Director Fuddy received numerous awards for her  
7 selfless work and tireless efforts in supporting children and  
8 the homeless, and combatting substance abuse, including the  
9 Hawaii Outstanding Advocate for Children and Youth Award, the  
10 Department of Health Sustained Superior and Exemplary  
11 Performance Award, the National Association of Social Workers  
12 Hawaii Chapter Lifetime Achievement Award, Ford Foundation -  
13 Innovations in American Government Award, National Committee to  
14 Prevent Child Abuse Award, Pro Humanitate Literary Award -  
15 Center for Child Welfare Policy, and Director's Award - Maternal  
16 & Child Health Bureau, United States Health Resources and  
17 Services Administration; and

19           WHEREAS, Director Fuddy devoted over thirty years of  
20 service to the people of Hawaii in all levels of government  
21 leadership, including serving as Mayor of Kalawao; and

23           WHEREAS, Director Fuddy made significant professional  
24 contributions throughout her career, having served as Chair and  
25 Ex-officio Director of the Hawaii Public Health Association,  
26 President of the Association of State and Territorial Public  
27 Health Social Workers, Treasurer and Secretary of the  
28 Association of Maternal and Child Health Programs, and on the  
29 Policy Committee of the Association of State and Territorial  
30 Health Officials; and



1 WHEREAS, Director Fuddy also made significant contributions  
2 to building the capacity of the public health workforce, and  
3 earned the respect of numerous public health practitioners and  
4 academics; and

6 WHEREAS, Director Fuddy's distinguished career was due in  
7 part to the outstanding education she received in her formative  
8 years; she was an alumnus of Sacred Hearts Academy, the  
9 University of Hawaii at Manoa, and Johns Hopkins University; and

11 WHEREAS, under Director Fuddy's watch, according to the  
12 United Health Foundation's America's Health Rankings: A Call to  
13 Action for Individuals & Their Communities, the State of Hawaii  
14 ranked as the healthiest state in the U.S. in 2013; now,  
15 therefore,

17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-seventh  
18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, the  
19 House of Representatives concurring, that this body hereby  
20 recognizes and honors the late Hawaii Department of Health  
21 Director Loretta Jean Deliana Antone Fuddy for the legacy she  
22 leaves behind in promoting the health and well-being of the  
23 people of Hawaii, and extends to her family its deepest  
24 condolences for their loss; and

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
27 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Hawaii State  
28 Department of Health, the University of Hawaii John A. Burns  
29 School of Medicine, School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene, and

32 Public Health Association, the American Public Health  
33 Association, the National Association of Social Workers, the  
34 Association of State and Territorial Health Officials, the

36 Hearts Academy, and the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg
