No. 457 entitled:

The purpose and intent of this measure is to transfer in fee
simple Hapuna Beach Park from the Department of Land and Natural
Resources to the County of Hawaii on January 1, 2014.

Your Committees received testimony in support of this measure
from the County of Hawaii. Your Committee received testimony in
opposition to this measure from the Department of Land and Natural
Resources.


Your Committees find that the jurisdiction over Hapuna Beach
Park, which is located on the island of Hawaii, should rightfully
rest with the County of Hawaii as the more appropriate government
administrative entity. According to testimony of the Department
of Land and Natural Resources, the State and the County of Hawaii
had previously worked to develop agreements to effectuate this
transfer in 2010. Your Committees note that this measure includes
transfer of jurisdiction provisions to address concerns raised in
testimony.

Your Committees have amended this measure by inserting the
tax map key number of the property to be transferred.


