Your Committee on Finance, to which was referred S.B. No. 886
entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VI,
SECTION 3, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION TO INCREASE THE
MANDATORY RETIREMENT AGE FOR STATE JUSTICES AND JUDGES,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to ensure an adequate number
of state justices and judges to accommodate the needs of the
State's judicial system by proposing a constitutional amendment to
increase the mandatory retirement age for such justices and judges
from 70 to 80.


The Department of the Attorney General and International

of Hawai'i provided comments.
