<u>HB 2426</u> <u>(HSCR162-14)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BIOSECURITY. Appropriates funds for the planning, design and construction of biosecurity facilities at harbors and airports throughout the State. Effective July 1, 2014.	TRN, AGR, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

PAPER: 3 copies (including an original) to Room 313 in the State Capitol;


