The following measure(s) has been **ADDED** to the agenda:

<u>HB 2012</u>	RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.	CPC
<u>Status</u>	Amends the Hawaii Revised Statutes relating to consumer protection.	

The following measure(s) were previously heard on **January 27, 2014**.

<u>HB 2003</u>	RELATING TO CYBERSECURITY.	CPC, FIN
<u>Status</u>	Establishes the Hawaii cybersecurity, economic, education, and infrastructure security council to develop methods to improve the State's cybersecurity.	

<u>HB 1763</u>	RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.	CPC, JUD
<u>Status</u>	Mandates insurance commissioner to assess a fine of up to \$10,000 for each violation by a pharmacy benefit manager or prescription drug benefit plan provider.	

<u>HB 1950</u>	RELATING TO SEAWATER AIR CONDITIONING.	CPC, FIN
<u>Status</u>	Enables the production of air conditioning in an area or district from a seawater air conditioning cooling system to benefit as an "eligible business activity" under the State's enterprise zones program.	



The following measure(s) were previously heard on **February 3, 2014.**

HB 2241
Status

RELATING TO PRODUCTION OF RECORDS.

CPC, JUD

Amends provisions of chapter 806D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, which allow for the service of process issued by another state upon a Hawaii recipient, and clarifies the following: (1) that the service of process may be upon a person or business, but not a government agency; (2) that the process is for the production of records; (3) that the process must be based upon a pending criminal investigation or prosecution; and (4) that the person or business being served must have conducted business or engaged in transactions or activities occurring at least in part in the issuing state. Requires the process to include specified information. For valid process, requires that the issuing state have a law authorizing the production of records by out-of-state persons or businesses and a reciprocity provision. Also amends the definition of "recipient," to clarify that the recipient, who receives process issued in Hawaii, must have conducted business or engaged in transactions or activities occurring at least in part in Hawaii.

HB 2242
Status

RELATING TO CRIME.

CPC, JUD

Updates the offenses of falsifying business records, obtaining a government-issued identification document under false pretenses in the first degree, obtaining a government-issued identification document under false pretenses in the second degree, tampering with a government record, and unsworn falsification to authorities, to address the use of new technology and make the offenses applicable to electronic or digital statements, documents, or records.

HB 2621
Status

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY.

CPC, JUD

Expands the procurement policy board's mandate to adopt rules regarding lost, stolen, damaged, unserviceable, or unsuitable property to include time limits as to issue reporting and a duty for government agencies and contractors to cooperate in the investigation of raised issues.

HB 2583
Status

RELATING TO ASSISTING UNLICENSED CONTRACTORS.

CPC, JUD

Clarifies that a contractor licensee who aids and abets an unlicensed contractor may be subject to additional discipline by the contractors license board.

HB 2549
Status

RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SERVICES.

CPC, FIN

Eliminates the enhanced 911 surcharge exemption for prepaid connections. Effective July 1, 2014.

HB 2015
Status

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

CPC, FIN

Requires insurers to pay the general excise tax and certificate of ownership fee to claimants involving motor vehicle insurance.

HB 2005
Status

RELATING TO A SECURITIES AND COMMODITIES EXCHANGE.

CPC, JUD

Establishes securities and commodities exchange to provide a marketplace for the trading of securities and commodities during the off hours of other exchanges. Provides for the trading of securities and commodities not available through other exchanges as well as those that are so available.



<u>HB 1853</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRUSTEES. Waives duty to diversify trust when trust provision directs retention of property. Requires dissenting trustee to dissent in writing to a failure to act or enter into a transaction. Allows settlor of a trust to designate investment function to an investment advisor, and administrative function to an administrative trustee.	CPC, JUD
<u>HB 2444</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY. Establishes certain requirements pertaining to lease-purchase agreements for real property. Establishes causes of action for violations.	CPC, JUD
<u>HB 2513</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MORTGAGE FORECLOSURES. Requires that an affirmation be filed with the court at the time a mortgage foreclosure action is commenced.	CPC, JUD
<u>HB 2482</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. Makes technical nonsubstantive amendments to the condominium law.	CPC, JUD
