<u>SB 2399, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2722)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Creates a geriatric research and technology park under the high technology development corporation. Designates certain properties to be included in the park. Appropriates funds. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)	EDB, HUS, FIN
<u>SB 2487, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2498)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ACT. Requires members of the small business regulatory review board to receive training by the appropriate division of the department of the attorney general. Clarifies the contents of the annual report that the small business regulatory review board must submit to the legislature. Sunsets the small business regulatory review board and chapter 201M, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Small Business Regulatory Flexibility Act, on 06/30/2019. (SD1)	EDB, CPC
<u>SB 2803, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2460)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THRILL CRAFT OPERATION. Makes permanent the exemption from the prohibition on operation of thrill craft in state waters for film production permit holders, authorized government personnel conducting operations approved by the department of land and natural resources, and ocean cleanup purposes. Takes effect on June 29, 2014. (SD1)	EDB, OMH
<u>SB 2981, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2690)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ECONOMY. Amends the state plan policies, objectives, and priority guidelines to promote and encourage innovative activity in the economy. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EDB, FIN



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
