(SSCR2799)
Status

RELATING TO THE MOTION PICTURES, DIGITAL MEDIA,
AND FILM PRODUCTION INCOME TAX CREDIT.
Requires film productions to comply with federal, state, and county
laws and secure all necessary film permit approvals with appropriate
state or county film offices and any appropriate state or county
agencies if a film production takes place on state or county property, in
order to be eligible for the motion picture, digital media, and film
production income tax credit. Prohibits qualified production costs that
have been financed with state funds from qualifying for the motion
picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit after
7/1/2014. Prohibits reality television from qualifying for the tax credit.
Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

demonstrations and university-based competitions. Effective 7/1/2050.

<u>SB 2776, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2802)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Requires the board of directors of the high technology development corporation to create a film and media park. Designates certain properties to be included in the park. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EDB, FIN
<u>SB 2832, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2775)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HIGH TECHNOLOGY. Amends section 206M-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to add a Small Business Innovation Research program award or contract as a qualifying criterion for grants from the High Technology Development Corporation. Increases the ceiling on any single transfer from the Hawaii capital loan revolving fund for grants from \$100,000 to an unspecified amount. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EDB, FIN
<u>SB 3126, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2573)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENTS. Prohibits noncompete agreements and restrictive covenants in employment contracts, post-employment contracts, or separation agreements that forbid post-employment competition of employees of a technology business or licensed physicians. <u>HCR 51 / HR 33 /</u> <u>Status / Status</u>	REQUESTING THAT THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY GATEWAY CENTER BE RENAMED IN HONOR OF GUY HIDEO TOYAMA.	EDB, VMI
<u>HCR 110 / HR 81 /</u> <u>Status / Status</u>	REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO RECOMMEND LEGISLATION OR CHANGES TO ADMINISTRATIVE RULES TO DEVELOP CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS BETWEEN THE STATE AND COMMUNICATION AND TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICE PROVIDERS AS TO THE USE OF PUBLIC LANDS FOR COMMUNICATION AND TELECOMMUNICATION INFRASTRUCTURE. DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

PAPER: 1 copies (including an original) to Room 318 in the State Capitol;


