HB 1535, HD1  
(HSCR167-14)  
Status

**RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.**

AGR, EDN, FIN

Requires the Department of Agriculture to issue a request for proposals to establish, develop, and implement a Hawaii Youth Agricultural Corps program, which provides agricultural education to youth and agricultural workforce development. Appropriation. Effective July 1, 2014. (HB1535 HD1)

HB 2008

**RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.**

EDN, FIN

Appropriates funds to the Department of Education to operate and implement the Future Farmers of America Program. Effective July 1, 2014.

HB 2109

**RELATING TO AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS FOR  
ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS.**

EDN, FIN

Establishes and funds the Fun 5 Program within the A+ Program in Hawaii's public elementary schools. Appropriation. Effective July 1, 2014.

HB 1868  
(HSCR153-14)

**RELATING TO EMERGENCY SHELTERS.**

PBS, EDN, FIN

Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to fund the retrofitting of public school buildings so they can also be used as emergency shelters.

HB 2457, HD1  
(HSCR228-14)

**RELATING TO DENTAL HEALTH.**

HLT, EDN, FIN

Requires the Department of Health to establish or enter into partnerships or agreements to administer a dental sealant program in a high-need school. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB2457 HD1)



HB 2562  
(HSCR95-14)  
Status

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE IMMERSION.  
Establishes a task force within the Department of Education to locate potential, viable properties along the Waianae coast, with a preference for a location in Nanakuli, on which to establish a Hawaiian language immersion school to educate students from kindergarten through grade twelve.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:
