SB 2169 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO FOOD AND MEDICAL SERVICES. Provides an exemption for food and medical services from the general excise tax.	HMS, WAM
SB 2206 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TAXATION. Establishes an earned-income tax credit and reduces or eliminates the state income tax liability for taxpayers with a federal adjusted gross income of less than 125 percent of the federal poverty guidelines set forth each year by the United States Department of Health and Human Services. Amends existing tax incentives for low-income household renters and taxpayers utilizing the refundable food/excise tax credit. Applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2014.	HMS, WAM
SB 2207 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INCOME TAX. Reduces or eliminates the state income tax liability for taxpayers with a federal adjusted gross income of less than 125 percent of the federal poverty guidelines set forth each year by the United States Department of Health and Human Services. Applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2014.	HMS, WAM
SB 2362 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TAXATION. Authorizes income tax return designations to the American Red Cross Hawaii State Chapter.	HMS, WAM
SB 2833 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INCOME TAXATION OF SENIORS. Provides an income tax exemption to taxpayers over 65 years of age who have federal adjusted gross income below certain thresholds.	HMS, WAM
SB 2834 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TAX CREDITS. Doubles the refundable food/excise tax credit amount for each taxpayer who is sixty-five years of age or older.	HMS, WAM
SB 2835 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INCOME TAX CREDIT FOR LOW-INCOME HOUSEHOLD RENTERS. Triples the low-income household renters credit for each taxpayer who is sixty-five years of age or older.	HMS, WAM
