HB 1505

RELATING TO CHILD SUPPORT.

HUS, JUD

Status

Requires that all child support payments go directly to an adult child if the adult child is presently enrolled as a full-time student in, or has been accepted into and plans to attend as a full-time student for the next semester, a post-high school university, college, or vocational

school.

HB 1588 **Status** 

RELATING TO QUALIFIED COMMUNITY REHABILITATION PROGRAMS.

HUS, FIN

Amends the exemption from the civil service laws for contracts for personal services, building, custodial, and grounds maintenance services with qualified community rehabilitation programs at a cost of no more than \$850,000 by specifying that the \$850,000 maximum

applies per contract.

HB 1621 Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCOMMODATIONS.

HUS, JUD, FIN

Adds homelessness, receipt of public assistance, and receipt of unemployment benefits as basis under which discrimination in public

accommodations is prohibited.

HB 1697 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO YOUTH.

HUS, FIN

Requires the office of youth services to coordinate a five-year safe places for youth pilot program to establish a network of safe places where youth can access safety and services. Establishes the position of safe places for youth program coordinator. Establishes rules to allow minors to consent to enter the safe places program and provide immunity from liability to safe place providers and other related

service providers. Makes appropriation.

HB 1754 Status

RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

HUS, FIN

Establishes and appropriates funds for the medicaid buy-in program for

workers with disabilities. Effective 7/1/14.

RELATING TO YOUTH. HUS, EDN, FIN HB 1756 Establishes the resources for enrichment, athletics, culture, and health (R.E.A.C.H.) program in the office of youth services to provide a **Status** standardized framework and funding for after-school programs in public middle and intermediate schools. Establishes a revolving fund to receive fees and other moneys to supplement the costs of administering and operating the program. Appropriates funds for establishing the R.E.A.C.H. program to provide funding for afterschool programs in middle and intermediate public schools. Establishes one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) position to support the program and appropriates funds for that position. HB 1785 RELATING TO YOUNG ADULT OFFENDERS. HUS, JUD, FIN Establishes the young adult rehabilitation special fund. Exempts Status young adult defendants from a sentence of life sentence without the possibility of parole except where required for murder or attempted murder. Prohibits young adult defendants from being transported out of state to serve sentences. Establishes within the department of public safety the temporary young adult rehabilitation advisory group. Makes appropriation. RELATING TO CHILD SUPPORT. HB 1787 HUS, JUD Requires adult children to annually demonstrate educational Status enrollment to continue receiving child support. HB 1993 RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. HUS, JUD, FIN Status Makes the commission of an act of physical abuse in the presence of a family or household member who is a minor under the age of fourteen a class C felony. HB 2034 RELATING TO SEXUAL ASSAULT. HUS, JUD Status Removes the statute of limitations for criminal and civil actions arising from sexual assault in the first and second degrees and continuous sexual assault of a minor under the age of fourteen years. HB 2035 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE HUS, JUD, FIN PROGRAMS. Status Appropriates funds for purchase of service contracts for domestic violence programs. Effective July 1, 2014.
