SB 2076 (SSCR2041) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO UNLICENSED CONTRACTOR FRAUD. Specifies that, for purposes of the offense of unlicensed contractor fraud, the "intent to deprive" may be formed before or after the person obtains or exerts control over the property of another.	CPN, JDL
SB 2260, SD1 (SSCR2024) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO WAGES AND HOURS ON PUBLIC WORKS. Increases the suspension period from three to five years for a third violation of a person or firm who violates state law on wages and hours of employees on public works. Clarifies the effective date of suspension. Specifies that suspension for falsification of records or delay or interference with an investigation is immediate. Specifies who the director of labor and industrial relations must notify of any suspension order. Repeals 06/30/2018. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD1)	CPN, JDL
SB 2250, SD1 (SSCR2045) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CHARITABLE SOLICITATION. Requires certain disclosures on collection boxes for donated clothing and household items by for-profit and nonprofit organizations; clarifies registration requirement for Hawaii domiciled charitable organizations and by nonprofits covered by an IRS Group Exemption Ruling; authorizes the Attorney General to require electronic financial reporting by professional solicitors; imposes a late fee for late financial reports by professional solicitors; amends the time within which commercial co-venturers must provide a final accounting to a charitable organization; clarifies exemptions from registration requirements; and makes other technical and housekeeping amendments to chapter 467B, Hawaii Revised Statutes. SB 2021 (SSCR2064) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO RESISTING ARREST. Creates the offense of resisting arrest in the first degree as a class C felony if the person intentionally prevents a law enforcement officer acting under color of the law enforcement officer's official authority from effecting an arrest by removing or attempting to remove a firearm from the person of a law enforcement officer. Amends the existing resisting arrest offense to resisting arrest in the second degree.	PSM, JDL



<p><u>SB 2258</u> <u>(SSCR2065)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE. Establishes knowingly or intentionally causing bodily injury to liquor commission investigators while performing their job duties as assault in the second degree.</p>	<p>PSM, JDL</p>
<p><u>SB 2032, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2018)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO VIOLENCE AGAINST HEALTH CARE PERSONNEL. Adds intentionally or knowingly causing bodily injury to medical services providers to assault in the second degree offense. Expands the medical services providers to which the offense would apply. (SD1)</p>	<p>HTH, JDL</p>
