(HSCR178)
Status

RELATING TO OCEAN RESOURCES.
Authorizes administrative inspections within the West Hawaii regional fishery management area. (HD1)

Status

RELATING TO COUNTY INFRASTRUCTURE CAPACITY
BUILDING CONSTRUCTION FINANCING.
Establishes a revolving fund to provide loans to counties, state agencies, or private developers for infrastructure improvements.
Makes appropriations.

HB 1651
Status

RELATING TO TAXATION.
Unless preempted by federal law, requires the collection of use taxes by sellers of tangible personal property who enter into agreements under which a person in the State refers potential purchasers to the seller, including by an internet link or web site, or performs related services in the State on behalf of the seller.

HB 1993
(HSCR51-14)
Status

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.
Makes the commission of an act of physical abuse in the presence of a family or household member who is a minor under the age of fourteen a class C felony.

<u>HB 2309, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR231-14)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES. Increases from \$1,000 per day to a maximum unspecified amount per day, administrative fines for violations of sanitation laws and rules for establishments required to undergo sanitation inspections by the Department of Health. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB2309 HD1)	HLT, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2442</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STATE CONTRACTS. Prohibits the State from contracting with an offeror that has committed fraud or certain other crimes within seven years preceding the offer. Effective July 1, 2014.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2590</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Allows voter registration at absentee polling places beginning in 2016 and late voter registration on election day at polling places beginning in 2018.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 274</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CRIMINAL PROCEDURE. Creates procedural and administrative requirements for law enforcement agencies for eyewitness identifications of suspects in criminal investigations. Grants a defendant the right to challenge any eyewitness identification to be used at trial in a pretrial evidentiary hearing. Takes effect 1/1/2014.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2182, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR218-14)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ACCESS TO JUSTICE. Establishes the Hawaii justice league program to provide loan repayments on behalf of eligible lawyers that pursue public interest work in Hawaii. Provides for loan repayments by the University of Hawaii William S. Richardson school of law. Creates the Hawaii justice league revolving fund. Effective July 1, 2525. (HB2182 HD1)	HED, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2533</u> <u>Proposed HD1</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE. Proposed HD1: Creates public funding program of candidates for the offices of state representative. Repeals provisions under the existing partial public financing program specifically applicable to candidates for the offices of governor, lieutenant governor, state senator, and state representative. Appropriates funds to the campaign spending commission to prepare for the public financing of elections in 2016, including staff support. Requires campaign spending commission to submit a report. Effective July 1, 2015.	JUD, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
