RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS FOR
STATE AND COUNTY EMPLOYEES.
Allows the State and counties to perform criminal history record
checks on employees, prospective employees, volunteers, and
contractors whose positions allow them access to sensitive
information, firearms for other than law enforcement purposes, and
secured areas related to a traffic management center. Allows the
counties to perform criminal history record checks prior to making an
employment offer, and be exempt from the ten year look-back period,
for prospective employees whose positions involve the handling or use
of firearms for other than law enforcement purposes. (SD1)

RELATING TO FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS.
Requires the financial disclosure statements of members of certain
boards and commissions to be made available for public inspection and
duplication. (SB2682 HD1)

RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS FOR
REAL ESTATE APPRAISERS.
Authorizes criminal background checks for real estate appraisers as
required by federal law. (SD1)

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT.

Updates chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to make it consistent with amendments to federal law on controlled substances. Amends sections 329-14, 329-18, and 329-20, HRS, to add new controlled substances federally scheduled as required under section 329-11, HRS. Effective July 1, 2112. (SB2882 HD1)

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM POWER OF ATTORNEY ACT.

CPC, JUD

Establishes the Uniform Power of Attorney Act. Defines the levels of authority granted in a power of attorney to the principal's agent. Requires the agent to act in good faith and within the scope of authority granted in the power of attorney. Provides sample documents to be used to create a statutory form power of attorney. Repeals Chapter 551D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Uniform Durable Power of Attorney Act. (SD2)

RELATING TO ASSOCIATION ALTERNATIVE POWER OF SALE FORECLOSURE PROCESS.

CPC, JUD

Clarifies the parties that a homeowners association can serve through publication, after a hearing before a judge, in a nonjudicial foreclosure proceeding.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

PAPER: 3 copies (including an original) to Room 438 in the State Capitol;

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 808-586-8504 (Oahu) or 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through e-mail or the Web); or

WEB: For testimony less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony. ~~Those wishing to provide oral testimony will be limited to two minutes.~~
