Proposed HD1
Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.
PROPOSED HD1: Requires the State Auditor to review the current civil service exemption process and make recommendations to ensure the appropriate use of this process. Requires the State Auditor to work with state departments and agencies, including the Department of Human Resources Development, to update and modernize job position descriptions.

HB 2299, HD1
(HSCR232-14)
Status

RELATING TO COMPLIANCE WITH THE HEALTH INSURANCE
PORTABILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT.
Requires the Department of Health to establish permanent or temporary privacy officer and security officer positions in compliance with federal information privacy and security laws. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB2299 HD1)

(HSCR213-14)
Status

RELATING TO TEACHERS.
Authorizes under the Teacher National Board Certification Incentive Program an additional \$5,000 per year bonus for teachers who maintain current national board certification and teach at a school in a focus, priority, or Superintendent's zone. (HB2597 HD1)
