SB 3122, SD2, HD1 (HSCR936-14) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

AUTHORITY. Authorizes residential development by OHA on specified parcels in

Kakaako Makai subject to public hearing, HCDA approval, and association fees to fund services and projects. Exempts development from public facilities dedication requirement. Effective July 1, 2050.

(SB3122 HD1)
