HB 1586  
Status

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, WAL, FIN

Exempts improvements to land to be used for airport purposes, authorized by the department of transportation, and for state and county highways, authorized by the appropriate state or county agency, from county approval and permitting requirements and from the definition of "development" for special management area permitting purposes.

HB 1811  
Status

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, FIN

Extends the sunset date of Act 46, SLH 2012, to authorize the Department of Transportation to extend the term of an airport concession, and to modify and amend the terms of any concession contracts, leases, and permits in exchange for revenue-enhancing improvements that are made or paid for by the concession.

HB 2147  
Status

RELATING TO CONCESSIONS.

TRN, CPC

Exempts the operation of concessions for wireless and communication services and for advertising from the public concession bidding process.

HB 1702  
Status

RELATING TO THE CAPITAL INFRASTRUCTURE TAX  
CREDIT.

TRN, FIN

Creates a capital infrastructure tax credit for tenants who are displaced by the Kapalama container terminal project. Allows banks and other financial corporations the ability to claim the capital infrastructure tax credit. Allows allocations of the capital infrastructure tax credit to a partner under a partnership agreement even if the allocation has a substantial economic effect. Renews the technology infrastructure renovation tax credit through 2019.



<u>HB 1610</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Allows the counties and the State to maintain roads whose ownership is in dispute without incurring liability.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 1509</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Specifies that operating a motor vehicle in the State while utilizing a mobile device is a traffic infraction. Specifies that the penalty for such an infraction shall be a fine of not less than \$150.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1706</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ILLEGAL PARKING UPON BIKEWAYS. Sets a minimum fine of \$100 for driving or parking a vehicle on a bicycle lane or pathway.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1771</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CIVIL AIR PATROL. Appropriates \$500,000 for fiscal year 2014-2015 to support operational mission readiness activities of the Hawaii Wing of the Civil Air Patrol, including facilities maintenance, not funded by the National Civil Air Patrol. Effective July 1, 2014.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 1667</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VETERANS. Exempts qualifying totally and permanently disabled veterans from paying the State motor vehicle registration fee. Requires the Office of Veterans Services to report the number of qualifying veterans to the legislature and department of taxation.	TRN, VMI, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.


Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
