<u>SB 3046</u> <u>(SSCR2524)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GOLD STAR FAMILY DAY. Designates the last Sunday in September as "Gold Star Family Day".	VMI
<u>SB 2131, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2610)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Requires the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for veterans of the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, and Navy, who were honorably discharged, beginning with the 2014-2015 academic year. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)	VMI, HED, FIN
<u>SB 2597, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2772)</u> <u>Status</u>	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR A WAR MEMORIAL. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates the proceeds therefrom for fiscal year 2014-2015 to the office of veterans' services for the planning, design, and construction of a memorial honoring the veterans of the Persian Gulf War, Operation Desert Storm, Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation New Dawn, Global War on Terrorism, Homeland Defense, and Operation Noble Eagle, and those who have protected our borders by land, sea, and air. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2617, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2659)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC WORKS OF ART. Amends the criteria for the works of art to be commissioned to honor the late U.S. Senator Daniel K. Inouye and the late U.S. Representative Patsy T. Mink pursuant to Act 281, SLH 2013. Amends the appropriation to an unspecified amount for the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium. Effective 07/01/2050. <u>SB 2620, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2576)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE WORKS OF ART SPECIAL FUND. Allows works of art acquired using moneys from the works of art special fund to be displayed and maintained in public buildings, including federal, state, and county buildings. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD2)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 233</u> <u>(SSCR2464)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO QUEEN LILIUOKALANI. Changes inscription on Queen Liliuokalani statue to the dates of her coronation and death.	VMI, OMH, FIN
<u>SB 2598, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2771)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE CULTURAL EXCHANGES BETWEEN HAWAII AND AFRICAN AMERICANS. Establishes the Hawaii commission on African American History and Culture to recognize the contributions of the African American people in Hawaii and educate residents and visitors to the State about these contributions. Appropriates funds to the Governor for the expenses of the commission. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 3107, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2522)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE INSTRUMENT. Establishes and designates the ukulele as the official state instrument. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD1)	VMI
<u>SB 317, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2302)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY. Re-designates the second Monday of October from "Discoverers' Day" to "Indigenous Peoples' Day". (SD1)	VMI
<u>SB 3125, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2733)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS. Requires the Auditor to conduct a financial and management audit of the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2742, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2712)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ESTABLISHMENT OF THE PACIFIC-ASIA INSTITUTE FOR RESILIENCE AND SUSTAINABILITY. Establishes the Pacific-Asia institute for resilience and sustainability to provide the structure and opportunity for a new generation of leaders to emerge who possess the ability to address Hawaii and the Pacific-Asia region's risks from natural and man-made hazards and to develop solutions for sustainable economic growth within the region's unique physical and cultural diversity. - Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through the website); or


WEB: For testimony less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.
