The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, convened at 12:09 o'clock p.m., with Speaker Souki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Linda Ichiyama, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Cachola, Carroll, Mizuno and Oshiro, who were excused.

"So, although they're well intended, and I certainly bear no ill will to the intent or the methodology behind them, I just think that we should fix the K-12 first, whether that's air conditioning or infrastructure or curriculum development or all the resources that are needed. That would be my focus. So, for those reasons, that's why I won't be supporting the myriad of these bills. Thank you."

Representative Johanson rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Fukumoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in reservations with brief comments. Mr. Speaker, there's probably no more important private body than the Council on Revenues. This bill is intended to research how they can do better, be better. The only equivalent of that on the federal level is probably the Federal Reserve. So, it's a very important body that predicts how much tax money is going to come in and how much money we can actually spend.

"The problem I have is three-fold. First, the testimony in the EDB Committee continually referred to the late or missing DOTAX data. Well, we didn't have the data from DOTAX. They didn't figure in the cash flow. They didn't have the solar tax credit figured in. Because DOTAX is not doing their job.

"Mr. Speaker, this bill is almost a half a million dollars, of which a good portion of it, maybe \$150,000 or \$175,000 is for DOTAX, which is more than sufficient. They've already identified the problem.

"Another point, however, is very loud and clear by its absence of testimony, is that the Council on Revenues didn't testify for or against this bill. They boycotted it. What does that tell you, Mr. Speaker? It's probably because they know what they need to do, but they don't want to make too many ruffled feathers given that they're not getting their stuff from the Department of Taxation.

"So, Mr. Speaker, with a half a million dollars at stake, and given all the other priorities that we just voted on, a school bill for preschools, *et cetera*. I think until there's clear indication that all the money is needed in addition to funding the DOTAX, why we have to rediscover the wheel, reinvent the wheel by knowing what the problem is. Those guys and gals who serve on the Council on Revenues know what the problem is. And we've heard in the testimony, it's the lack of data or missing data or untimely data.

"For that reason, Mr. Speaker, I would encourage further consideration of modifying this and taking out some of the money that's not necessary and going for the Department of Taxation. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Fale rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Say rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I apologize, but at this point in time may I state for the record that I'm strongly opposed to House Bill 1512. Primarily because it would conflict with the House-Senate Majority policy legislation that the Policy Chair had worked on during this past interim. This deals with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, where the testimony from the Lieutenant Governor was very weak, that they did not know who had introduced this legislation.

"I am concerned because we may be setting the policy of having two positions on the issue of climate change, global warming. And I do support the House-Senate Majority Package legislation, which was developed by the Representative from Waipahu. And secondly, we did put in positions, if I can recall, on the joint committee. So, for those reasons, I'm strongly opposed to the powers of the Lieutenant Governor doing the work that the Office of Planning has been delegated with another bill that is before us."

Representative Hanohano rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Fale rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, strong reservations and one brief comment. This is a matter where we seem to be maybe putting a couple too many cooks in the kitchen that may result in some duplicative measures, Mr. Speaker, which would be contrary to effective and efficient government. So, for those reasons, Mr. Speaker, I have strong reservations in regards to this measure."

Representative Har rose in support of the measure with reservations and asked that the remarks of Representative Say be entered into the Journal as her own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Tokioka rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 1512, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO POWERS OF THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Hanohano, McDermott and Say voting

no, and with Representatives Cachola, Carroll, Mizuno and Oshiro being excused.

Representatives Evans and Hanohano, for the Committee on Water & Land and the Committee on Ocean, Marine Resources, & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 379-14) recommending that H.B. No. 1911, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Cabanilla and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 1911, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Cachola, Carroll, Mizuno and Oshiro being excused.

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 380-14) recommending that S.B. No. 499, SD 1, HD 1, as amended in HD 2, pass Third Reading.

By unanimous consent, consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 380-14 on S.B. No. 499, SD 1, HD 2, was deferred and in accordance with Article III, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, printed copies of S.B. No. 499, SD 1, HD 2, were made available to the Members of the House.
