## **Committee** REFERRAL HB1568 RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING CREDITS. HSG, FIN Extends to June 30 2018, the time period in which affordable housing credits are required to be issued for each single-family residence, multi-family unit, other residential unit, or if allowed under the county's affordable housing programs, vacant lot, developed by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands. Effective July 1, 2014. HB1569 RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN Provides for the taxation of the pension income of: (1) an individual filer with federal adjusted gross income of \$100,000 or more; (2) a joint or surviving spouse filer with federal adjusted gross income of \$200,000 or more; and (3) a head of household with federal adjusted gross income of \$150,000 or more. Effective for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2013. HB1570 RELATING TO ABUSE OF FAMILY OR HOUSEHOLD PBS, JUD MEMBER. Extends the period of separation that a police officer can order under suspicion of physical abuse or harm to 4:30 p.m. on the second business day following the weekend or legal holiday if the forty-eight hour period of separation expires on any Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday or if the incident occurs after 12:00 p.m. on any Friday, or on any Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. HB1571 RELATING TO GARDENS. EDN/HED, FIN Authorizes the department of education and Hawaii community development authority to develop programs that provide incentives to establish school and community gardens. MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HB1572 JUD, FIN THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI. Appropriates funds to the department of the prosecuting attorney of the county of Maui for the prosecution of cases under the drug court and mental health court programs. RELATING TO JUVENILE JUSTICE INFORMATION. HB1573 JUD Allows the dissemination of information from the juvenile justice information system to law enforcement agencies for purposes of

the administration of law enforcement and law enforcement

agency employment.

## **Committee** REFERRAL HB1574 RELATING TO HABITUALLY OPERATING A VEHICLE TRN, JUD WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF AN INTOXICANT. Expands definition of "habitual operator of a vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant" to include violators with at least one conviction within the last ten years for offense of habitually operating a vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant. RELATING TO HEALTH. HB1575 HLT/HUS, JUD Authorizes the Department of Health, beginning January 1, 2016, to post on its website information concerning a major and adjudicated patient care violation when the order specifying the violation is final and the violation was discovered in specified state-licensed care facilities, adult day care centers, and community care foster family homes. Effective July 1, 2014. HB1576 RELATING TO FOSTER CARE SERVICES. HUS. FIN Increases the monthly board rate for foster care services. Makes an appropriation. Requires DHS to report on impact of board rate increase. RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. HB1577 HLT, CPC, FIN Establishes a five-year pilot program at UH-JABSOM for the medical treatment of veterans and traumatic brain injury treatment of residents. Establishes a special fund within the Insurance Division to reimburse health care providers and purchase medical equipment. Prohibits third-party payors from denying reimbursement for hyperbaric oxygen treatment. Authorizes the Insurance Division to seek reimbursement from third-party payors. Authorizes GO bonds. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN. HB1578 EDN, FIN Deletes the repeal of junior kindergarten, scheduled to take effect on July 1, 2014, pursuant to Act 178, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012. HB1579 RELATING TO JUDGMENT LIENS. WAL, JUD Clarifies that money judgments are considered valid liens against all real property, including registered property, when recorded in the bureau of conveyances. RELATING TO THE COUNTIES. HB1580 JUD Exempts counties and their employees from liability for removing personal property from public property.

Granting temporary relief from county housing requirements as recommended by the construction industry task force to stimulate housing construction statewide.

#### HB1582 RELATING TO APPLICATION PROCESSING.

Establishes a maximum time period within which an application for permit, license, or approval shall be acted upon by the designated agency or else deemed granted; authorizes each county to contract with a third-party reviewer to streamline the processing of applications; clarifies that previously approved projects that do not impact historic properties are not subject to subsequent reviews by SHPD.

#### HB1583 RELATING TO RETAIL WHEELING.

EEP, CPC

Requires the public utilities commission to establish rules and policies and issue orders related to retail wheeling to enable renewable energy producers operating on state lands to sell electricity directly to state government entities located on the same island as the producer.

#### HB1584 RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Establishes a renewable energy facility siting process to expedite the review and action upon state and county permits necessary for the siting, development, construction, and operation of a renewable energy facility.

### HB1585 RELATING TO BIOFUEL FACILITIES.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Expands the facility tax credit to include various biofuels; amends the definition of nameplate capacity; requires a qualifying facility to be located within the State and utilize locally grown feed stock for at least seventy-five per cent of its production output; increases the maximum annual amount of certified credits from \$12,000,000 to \$20,000,000; and removes the 40,000,000 gallon production per year cap. Applies to taxable years after 12/31/14.

### HB1586 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, WAL, FIN

Exempts improvements to land to be used for airport purposes, authorized by the department of transportation, and for state and county highways, authorized by the appropriate state or county agency, from county approval and permitting requirements and from the definition of "development" for special management area permitting purposes.
