<u>HB1675</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires all public secondary schools to implement a school year that includes nine hundred ninety student instructional hours beginning with the 2014-2015 school year. Repeals the requirement that by the 2016-2018 school years, all public schools implement a school year of one hundred eighty days and one thousand eighty student instructional hours for both elementary and secondary school grades. Clarifies that the definition of "student instructional hours" shall be determined by the board of education.	EDN, FIN

HB1676 RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING. EDN, FIN

Authorizes the executive office on early learning to enter into agreements with the department of education and charter schools for use of vacant or underutilized classrooms as public preschool classrooms. Makes an appropriation.

LAB, FIN

BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Prohibits the EUTF from paying medicare part B reimbursements to retired public employees and spouses who did not receive health benefits with the State during the period of the employee's

employment.

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION. HB1678

WAL

Provides that historic properties shall be over seventy-five years old. Provides that nothing in chapter 6E, HRS, shall be construed to require a review by the DLNR for residential property that has not been entered, or nominated by the owner of the residence for entry, onto the Hawaii register of historic places.

HB1679 RELATING TO THE DIAMOND HEAD SEAWALL. WAL/OMH, FIN

Appropriates \$3,000,000 for FY 2014-2015 to the department of land and natural resources for planning, design, and construction costs associated with assessing, repairing, and maintaining the Diamond Head seawall.

RELATING TO MEMBERS OF CONGRESS. HB1680

JUD, FIN

Provides that when a candidate other than the incumbent is elected to Congress, and the incumbent vacates the office prior to the expiration of the incumbent's term, the Governor must appoint the member-elect to immediately fill the vacancy.

HB1681 RELATING TO CHILD HEALTH. HLT, FIN

Creates an appropriation for early intervention services and a web-based early intervention data system. Creates an appropriation for services for children with developmental concerns who do not qualify for services through the Individuals with Disabilities Improvement Education Act including family liaison services and medical home integration with Hi'ilei Hawai'i. Creates an appropriation for school-based vision, hearing, and obesity screening. Creates an appropriation for expenses needed to fund multiagency reviews of child deaths and re-establish a child death review coordinator position.

<u>HB1686</u>	RELATING TO OPIHI. Requires the DLNR to adopt rules to regulate the taking or harvesting of opihi from the coastal areas or nearshore waters of the island of Niihau by nonresidents of the island. Prohibits the taking or harvesting of opihi until the DLNR adopts rules. Establishes penalties. Requires DLNR to submit annual reports.	OMH, JUD
<u>HB1687</u>	RELATING TO FISHING. Prohibits commercial fishing within one mile of the shoreline of the island of Niihau.	OMH, JUD
HB1688	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Grants certain lessees of public land the right of first refusal to extend or renew a lease prior to a public auction of the land. Establishes appraisal process to assist in the determination of the fair market value of the land for rental purposes where the lease is renewed or extended. Provides for the disposition of improvements to the land where the lease is not renewed or extended.	WAL, FIN
<u>HB1689</u>	RELATING TO MAUNA KEA. Requires UH to use a fair market value rate for the lease of its Mauna Kea lands when calculating the 20% pro rata share of lease revenues to the public land trust fund in fulfillment of the university's pro rata share of ceded land revenues owed to the office of Hawaiian affairs. Requires reports to the legislature.	HED, WAL/OMH, FIN

<u>HB1690</u> RELATING TO SCHOOLS.

EDN, FIN

Requires the DOE to establish: (1) standards for noise control and air conditioning at school facilities; and (2) a priority list of schools with the greatest need for air conditioning. Appropriates funds for noise control and air conditioning in public schools.

<u>HB1691</u> RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS.

TRN/PBS, JUD,

FIN

Prohibits the use of unmanned aircraft systems, commonly known as drones, for the collection of images, sound waves, or other information, except with appropriate consent, under a search warrant, or under other exceptions for certain law enforcement, counter-terrorist, and military operations. Provides civil remedies for aggrieved parties. Prohibits the use of improperly obtained information as evidence except in certain circumstances.

<u>HB1692</u> RELATING TO TOURISM.

TOU, FIN

Requires the Hawaii Tourism Authority's tourism marketing plan to be a single, comprehensive document and requires the Hawaii Tourism Authority to report on the progress of its tourism marketing plan in its annual report.

HB1693 RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

HUS, FIN

Requires the State to pay interest on late payments to an operator of an adult day care facility, community care foster family home, or adult residential care home. Effective July 1, 2014.

HB1694 RELATING TO FOSTER CARE.

HUS, FIN

Increases the minimum monthly foster care basic board rate and foster care maximum difficulty of care rate. Requires Department of Human Services to report to the Legislature prior to 2015 Regular Session on implementation and cost. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2014.

HB1695 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

HUS, FIN

Amends the state supplemental income for adult residential care homes (ARCHs), expanded ARCHs, and other homes specified in section 346-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and changes the public assistance allowance to equal an unspecified percentage of the current poverty level established by the federal government. Effective July 1, 2014.

<u>HB1696</u> RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

EDN

Authorizes charter high schools to charge tuition to foreign students who study online with the school and attend the school for at least one semester to earn a diploma in accordance with DOE standards.

HB1697 RELATING TO YOUTH. HUS, FIN

Requires the office of youth services to coordinate a five-year safe places for youth pilot program to establish a network of safe places where youth can access safety and services. Establishes the position of safe places for youth program coordinator. Establishes rules to allow minors to consent to enter the safe places program and provide immunity from liability to safe place providers and other related service providers. Makes

appropration.

HB1698 RELATING TO NURSES. HLT, CPC

Provides that the scope of practice for advanced practice registered nurses includes certain oral health treatment.

HB1699 RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE. WAL, CPC

For agency failure to act within established time periods on applications for business and development-related permits and licenses, repeals provisions that require automatic application approval or require an application to be deemed complete.

RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET. HB1700

FIN

To adjust and request appropriations for Fiscal Biennium 2013-15 funding requirements for operations and capital improvement projects of Executive Branch agencies and programs.

RELATING TO ASSAULT OF SPORTS OFFICIALS. HB1701

JUD

Makes it a Class C felony to assault a sports official as a result of

the performance of duty at a sports event.

HB1702 RELATING TO THE CAPITAL INFRASTRUCTURE TAX TRN, FIN

CREDIT.

Creates a capital infrastructure tax credit for tenants who are displaced by the Kapalama container terminal project. Allows banks and other financial corporations the ability to claim the capital infrastructure tax credit. Allows allocations of the capital infrastructure tax credit to a partner under a partnership agreement even if the allocation has a substantial economic effect. Renews the technology infrastructure renovation tax

credit through 2019.

RELATING TO TAXATION. HB1703

FIN

Imposes a conveyance tax on the conveyance of a controlling interest of an entity that has an interest in real property in the State. Applies to conveyances occurring after 06/30/2014.

Effective 07/01/2014.

Committee REFERRAL HB1704 RELATING TO RESEARCH ACTIVITIES. **FIN** Clarifies that sections 41 and 280C(c) of the Internal Revenue Code shall be relied upon for calculating the state tax credit for research activities except that references to the base amount shall not apply and credit for all qualified research expenses may be taken without regard to the amount of expenses for previous years. HB1705 RELATING TO FIREFIGHTERS. LAB, FIN Provides firefighters with comprehensive medical coverage through workers compensation law and service connected disability retirement benefits through a presumptive law for cancer, blood-borne infectious diseases, and exposure to a biochemical substance. Effective July 1, 2014. RELATING TO ILLEGAL PARKING UPON BIKEWAYS. HB1706 TRN, JUD Sets a minimum fine of \$100 for driving or parking a vehicle on a bicycle lane or pathway. HB1707 RELATING TO OPIHI. OMH, JUD Establishes a moratorium on the harvesting of opihi on Oahu until July 1, 2019. Establishes a ban on taking or harvesting opihi statewide, subject to open and closed seasons and traditional rights. RELATING TO MARIJUANA. HB1708 JUD, FIN Legalizes the personal use of marijuana in a specified quantity. Requires licensing to operate marijuana establishments. Subjects marijuana establishments to excise taxes and income taxes. RELATING TO MARIJUANA. HB1709 JUD, FIN Establishes a civil violation for possession of one ounce or less of marijuana that is subject to a fine of \$100. RELATING TO COUNTIES. HB1710 JUD, FIN

Provides that each county has the power to establish compassion centers for the dispensing of medical marijuana. Requires that compassion centers shall only provide service to qualifying patients and primary caregivers registered with the department of public safety (department of health beginning January 2, 2015). Makes compassion centers subject to the general excise tax by making inapplicable the exemption for amounts received from sales of prescription drugs or prosthetic devices. Imposes a general excise tax on marijuana sales. Imposes registration fee

on compassion centers, to be shared with counties.

Committee REFERRAL HB1711 RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE VMI. FIN AND THE ARTS. Clarifies that a state art museum be established on each of the islands of Kauai, Hawaii, Lanai, Maui, and Molokai to provide access to the general public to view the state art collection. FIN HB1712 RELATING TO STATE BONDS. Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds. Makes findings required by article VII, section 13 of the state constitution to declare that issuance of authorized bonds will not cause the debt limit to be exceeded. RELATING TO AGING. HLT, FIN HB1713 Appropriates general funds to provide ongoing financial support to healthy aging programs and services. Requires the Executive Office on Aging to conduct a public education and awareness campaign on long-term care and appropriates general funds for its support and evaluation. Effective July 1, 2014. HB1714 RELATING TO CLIMATE CHANGE. EEP, FIN Addresses climate change adaptation by tasking the sustainability coordinator to create initial reports identifying expected climate impacts. Tasks the Office of Planning with establishing and implementing strategic climate adaptation plans and policy recommendations based on reports from sustainability coordinator. Establishes an interagency climate council with the task of implementing a general state policy to address climate change through 2050. Appropriates funds for staffing and resources. Effective July 1, 2014. RELATING TO THE INVESTOR EDUCATION PROGRAM. CPC, FIN HB1715 Appropriates funds for the continued operation of the investor education program, targeted to kupuna, within the department of commerce and consumer affairs office of the securities commissioner. MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR INVASIVE SPECIES HB1716 AGR, FIN PREVENTION, CONTROL, OUTREACH, RESEARCH, AND

Committee REFERRAL HB1717 RELATING TO THE RETENTION OF BIOLOGICAL PBS, JUD EVIDENCE. Establishes specific offenses for which evidence shall be retained. Allows law enforcement agencies to petition the court to dispose of biological evidence. Requires the court to use a preponderance of evidence standard in determining whether to allow the law enforcement agency to dispose of the biological evidence. RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE. HUS, CPC HB1718 Requires long-term care insurance policies or certificates to cover care at adult residential care homes, expanded adult residential care homes, and community care foster family homes. Effective July 1, 2014. RELATING TO TAXATION. HB1719 FIN Reduces the tax liability for low-income taxpayers by creating a tax credit that will eliminate a taxpayer's income tax liability if their federal adjusted gross income falls below federal poverty guidelines. Reduces a taxpayer's income tax liability by 50% if the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income falls between 100-125% of federal poverty guidelines. HB1720 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN THE BENEFIT OF THE 38TH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the 38th representative district. Effective July 1, 2014. HB1721 RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. JUD Amends the Uniform Controlled Substances Act by adding a definition for "marijuana extract," adding new scheduling criteria to the five scheduling sections for controlled substances, and making marijuana and marijuana extract a schedule II controlled substance under Hawaii law.

Makes an appropriation to establish and fund two special emergency medical response vehicle units based in Puna and Makalei on the island of Hawaii, including acquisition of HLT, FIN

vehicles, equipment and personnel costs.

Committee REFERRAL HB1723 RELATING TO PSYCHIATRIC FACILITIES. HLT, JUD Requires the administrator or attending physician of a psychiatric facility to provide notice of intent to discharge a patient or patient's admission to voluntary treatment. Applies section 334-60.7, HRS, to only civil commitments as a direct result of legal proceedings. Requires the notice to be served by mail at the person's last known address, unless the person waives this right in writing. Requires courts to conduct hearings within seventytwo hours to determine if the patient still meets the criteria for involuntary hospitalization. RELATING TO ADULT CARE. HB1724 HLT/HUS, FIN Authorizes adult residential care homes, expanded adult residential care homes, and adult foster homes to deny readmission of a resident who has been in a hospital for five days or more or, after discharge from the hospital, requires a level of care the care home is not authorized to provide. RELATING TO ADULT FOSTER HOMES. HLT/HUS HB1725 Prohibits the Department of Health from imposing minimum structural requirements on adult foster homes and community care foster homes that operate under a current and valid license prior to July 1, 2014. Effective July 1, 2014. HB1726 RELATING TO TAXATION. CPC, FIN Amends the corporation income tax by taxing real estate investment trusts without regard to the federal deduction for dividends paid. HB1727 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. HED, FIN Repeals the authority of the University of Hawaii to issue revenue bonds. HB1728 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TRN, WAL, FIN Specifies that a government agency does not assume ownership or jurisdiction over a disputed road solely through maintenance or repair activities. Authorizes the State to quitclaim ownership of roads in favor of counties. Establishes necessary funding for the maintenance and repair of disputed roads through the authorization of an additional county surcharge on state tax. RELATING TO DAM AND RESERVOIR SAFETY. WAL, FIN HB1729

Requires the board of land and natural resources to prepare all studies to determine the safe removal or retirement of a dam or reservoir upon the request of a homeowner association or homeowner of property where a dam or reservoir is situated.

HB1934 RELATING TO HOUSING.

HUS/HLT, FIN

Part I: Appropriates funds to the department of health for substance abuse treatment, mental health support services, and clean and sober housing services. Part II: Appropriates funds for a rental assistance program, also known as a shallow subsidy program. Parts III and IV: Appropriates funds to the department of human services to continue to administer housing first programs for chronically homeless individuals and to reestablish the homeless prevention and rapid re-housing program. Part V: Appropriates matching funds for the federal continuum of care permanent supportive housing programs to provide rental assistance in connection with supportive services.
