Tuesday, February 11, 2014

The Senate of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2014, convened at 11:33 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Sixteenth Day.

At this time, Senator Galuteria welcomed a group of students from King William C. Lunalilo Elementary School who were accompanied by teachers Mrs. Kinoshita and Mrs. Tawata and other chaperones. Senator Galuteria noted that the school's namesake, King Lunalilo, was the first monarch of Hawai'i to be voted into office after succeeding King Kamehameha IV.
