The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 527, nominating Ms. Leiana Robinson to the Island Burial Council, Islands of Kaua'i and Ni'ihau, to expire June 30, 2017.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. With regard to previously known burials, the Councils determine whether to leave the burial in place or remove it, recognize lineal and cultural descendants and provide counsel and advice to the Department.

Ms. Robinson was born and raised on Ni'ihau. That gives her a unique perspective. She brings to the Island Burial Council thoughts, experiences, and opinions unique to someone who speaks the mother tongue, Hawaiian, as it is a language that provides a unique identification of culture and its people.

Ms. Robinson has previously served on the Kaua'i-Ni'ihau Islands Burial Council and she remains eagerly committed to continue that service to her people.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Ms. Robinson's valuable knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the Island Burial Council until June 30, 2017.
