Dear Chair Taniguchi, Vice-Chair Kahele and Members of the Senate Higher Education Committee:

Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to provide <u>comments</u> on the selection of these individuals to the University of Hawaii's Board of Regents. I have not met or interviewed any of these candidates.

The University of Hawaii is currently in a situation which will require management expertise. Article X Section 6 of our Hawaii State Constitution states: "The board shall also have exclusive jurisdiction over the internal structure, management, and operations of the University." Further, HRS 304A-321 (b), Independent Audit Committee; established; powers; duties states: "The independent audit committee shall consist of at least three but not more than five members who shall be appointed by the chairperson of the Board of Regents..." "The independent audit committee shall include one or more individuals with financial expertise."

I believe the **financial expertise** required for membership on the audit committee should include the following skill set and experience:

- 1. Ability to read financial statements and management comments.
- Ability to understand the state of Hawaii and University of Hawaii budgeting scheme.
- 3. Ability to understand and evaluate the financial information given to the board by management.
- 4. Ability to recognize and understand enterprise risk management.

I would request that the committee question each candidate to see if the candidate meets the qualifications for the audit committee, evaluate the composition of the current board, and determine if future or current selections meet the requirements of this statute.
