

My first interactions with Joseph began when, as a student of a colleague of mine at Miami University Ohio, he applied to our graduate program in Oceanography. My close colleague recommended him highly, our program accepted Joseph, and I then began my role as his graduate advisor. The relationship has been a strong one ever since. Although Joseph exhibited a strong interest in ocean sciences, it was immediately apparent that he was an extremely well rounded person and, as he categorized himself, a philosopher of science. Such an attribute is truly accurate for Joseph, and it is his particularly broad philosophical approach to life that makes him an ideal candidate for serving on the environmental council.

Joseph is an individual with truly amazing qualifications. I would judge his intellectual capability to be in the top 1-2% of all the students I have ever encountered. More importantly he has superb communication skills and a wonderful ability to make all around him feel comfortable with his presence. I cannot recall any individual with whom Joseph has not been able to interact in a positive manner and he has always been willing to step forward to take on leadership roles, both academically, socially and, since his graduation from our program, professionally.

Some examples of Joseph's capabilities are exemplified in the wide array of endeavors he has undertaken and the positions he has held. Prior to joining my group, Joseph managed field operations and laboratory research projects in the McMurdo Dry Valleys of Antarctica. This he did as an undergraduate student while at Miami University Ohio. At UH Manoa he served as the Head Teaching Assistant of my introductory oceanography course (OCN 201 and OCN 201-L) that serves about 500 students a year. While a graduate student he also organized and served as Co-chief Scientist on the UH research vessel R/V Kilo Moana in support of my oceanography methods course (OCN 633).

Needless to say, Joseph performed very well academically in our department but showed his worth to me much more on the research side. He chose a very challenging problem for his Master's thesis, the analysis of rare earth elements in seawater. These elements are present at such low concentrations that their determination is difficult using the most advanced techniques available when Joseph was a student in my laboratory. I need to point out that the

chemical complexity of seawater compounded the difficulty with which he was faced. Yet, Joseph was able to modify and improve considerably a method that I had developed in collaboration with a prior student and produced results that could, at the time, only be achieved with much more sophisticated instrumentation and through considerably more complex analytical procedures. His work was highly recognized by the top scientists in our field at the time. This recognition, however, did not come easily... It was only through Joseph's displayed strong motivation, ingenuity, perseverance, and incredible work ethics that he was able to bring his project to fruition.

Since the time Joseph completed his tenure as my graduate student we have remained friends. I interact with him regularly, now mostly as a result of our common interest in sailing, a hobby to which I introduced him when he first joined my group. Joseph has been an important player in the Hawaii sailing community over the years, where he contributed his time unselfishly to the racing committee of the Hawaii Yacht Club (HYC), including serving as the Rear Commodore for Sail of HYC. Again, it was his leadership qualities that were the key to his success in this post. As you likely know Joseph returned to school to obtain an MBA degree and is currently the Environmental Compliance Manager for Grace Pacific LLC in Hawaii, where he has had to establish and maintain multiple business relationships, manage complex problem, as well as interact closely with government officials and regulatory agencies. The latter he has achieved brilliantly!

Joseph is a very collaborative individual who takes the time to listen respectfully to all sides of a discussion, he critically assesses the situation at hand, then provides well thought out recommendations for the benefit of all. Questions Submitted by Senator Mike Gabbard

1. Why do you wish to be a member of the Environmental Council?

Serving on the Environmental Council is an opportunity to give back to the community, integrating my knowledge and understanding of Hawaii's environmental health with other members of the Council. I offer a unique and diverse set of experiences that will add contextual clarity to the Council's deliberations and decisions.

2. How do you perceive the role and responsibilities of a member of the Environmental Council?

The Environmental Council has three broadly defined responsibilities as outlined in HRS 341-6. These include acting as a liaison between the OEQC and the general public in matters concerning ecology and environmental quality, reviewing the state's progress toward achieving its environmental goals and policies, and administrative rulemaking authority to implement HRS 343. Individual members of the Council share a common goal of implementing these responsibilities.

In order for the overall Council to work effectively, individual members have to put forth the necessary time and effort to get the job done. For instance, in the past, the Council has had challenges achieving a quorum at their meetings. By simply attending the Council meetings, individual members help to ensure that Council business can be conducted by achieving a quorum. While "simply" attending the meetings is important, Council members need to be *fully* engaged with the activities of the Council by participating in one or more of the committees and staying up-to-date on current events that have the potential to impact Hawaii's environment. Additionally, Council members must ensure that their activities meet ethical considerations, such as Hawaii's Sunshine Law.

3. Given your understanding of the role and responsibilities of a member of the Environmental Council, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position? Please include a brief statement of your skills, expertise, or knowledge that would aid in your decision-making ability as a member of the Environmental Council

With graduate degrees in both Oceanography and Business Administration from the University of Hawaii at Manoa, I have an educational foundation that is well-suited to the challenges facing the Council. As the Environmental Compliance Manager at Grace Pacific LLC, I am intimately familiar with the environmental regulations that affect businesses in the industrial and construction sectors in Hawaii, and how those regulations protect human health and the environment. During my tenure at Grace Pacific, I have advocated for and accomplished systemic changes within the

company to reduce emissions, minimize waste, increase recycling, improve energy efficiency, and utilize alternative resources.

I have also played an active role in volunteer organizations associated with environmental quality. These include serving on the Board of Directors for Honolulu Clean Cities, on the Steering Committee for the Environmental Forum of the Associated General Contractors of America (AGC), and on the Environmental Committee for the General Contractors Association of Hawaii (GCA) and the National Asphalt Pavement Association (NAPA). Through these volunteer activities, I have been able to work closely with organizations that normally site "across the table" from a private company, such as regulatory authorities and nonprofit organizations.

With this broad set of experiences, I have the ability to thoughtfully consider the implications of the Council's decisions from multiple perspectives. These might include the time it takes to plan for development, the environmental benefits of a given decision, the impact of increased regulatory burden, and the ways in which uncertainty in the permitting process can affect project financing.

4. What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service?

I am not entering this position with a set "agenda" per se. However, I would like to help shape policies that move Hawaii towards a more sustainable future, such as recycling, energy efficiency, alternative energy, and smart growth. With that said, I understand that the relatively short duration of this position (one year) limits the overall impact I might have.

5. Name three qualities that best describe you and that would make you stand out. How would these qualities benefit the Environmental Council?

Collaborative – I relish the opportunity to work as part of a larger group or team. Whether it's active participation through a brainstorming session, or delegation of tasks under a larger project, I believe that the best ideas, the best policies, are those that incorporate the ideas of multiple stakeholders. The act of collaboration helps to create a better end result than if one person works alone.

Thoughtful – With a strong background in science and philosophy, I am thoughtful of my actions and my words. I try to ensure that information upon which I make decisions is not just "fact-checked," but comes from a solid understanding of the underlying concepts. While emotion often drives the most contentious issues, it is important to take a step back, understand the relevant concepts and the underlying assumptions, try to find common ground if possible, and make decisions based on the best of our human understanding.

Respectful – I strive to treat others with respect, whether I agree with them or not. This is particularly important in the Environmental Council, since members may have deeply rooted opinions that sometimes conflict with each other on some matters. In order to work together with collaborative, thoughtful purpose, we need to respect each others' ideas and points of view.

6. Name one previous experience that would make you stand out. How would this benefit the Environmental Council?

My experience as a graduate student in oceanography is one distinguishing characteristic from my background. Through a mix of teaching, research, and academic coursework, I gained a solid understanding of the chemical, biological, and physical systems at work in the ocean such as global climate change, sea level rise, and marine ecology. These are all topics that have a direct bearing on Hawaii's environmental quality. Additionally, many of the concepts that I learned as an oceanography student can be applied to Hawaii's terrestrial environment, including groundwater resources, natural energy resources (i.e. solar, wind, geothermal, and wave energy), waste management, and invasive species control. With this aspect of my background, I will be able to offer informed opinions based on our scientific understanding of Hawaii's environment to the Council.

7. Can you foresee any possible conflicts of interests that could arise during your service on the Environmental Council? How would you overcome any possible conflicts of interest?

As a member of the Environmental Council, the possibility exists that I could be involved in some sort of official action that affects a business in which I have a substantial financial interest, such as my employer (Grace Pacific LLC) and its parent company (Alexander & Baldwin, Inc.). If such a conflict of interest were to arise, I would carefully review the relevant legal requirements (i.e., HRS 84-14) and, if necessary, recuse myself from any discussions, deliberations, and official votes on the matter.
