Subject: H.B. 1664, H.D. 1 Relating to Fire Protection for Fireworks

I am Manuel P. Neves, Chair of the Hawaii State Fire Council (SFC) and Fire Chief of the Honolulu Fire Department (HFD). The SFC and the HFD support H.B. 1664, H.D. 1, which proposes to require permanent and temporary fireworks storage buildings where redistribution activities are performed comply with adopted building or fire codes or the latest edition of nationally recognized standards.

In addition to fireworks being a potentially dangerous product during its use, dangers also exist during transport and storage. The proposed definitions are based on nationally recognized standards for safety and best industry practices to protect lives and property that will be applicable statewide.

Redistribution involves unpacking, segregating, and repacking fireworks shipments, which are then shipped to the neighbor islands or transported to retail locations. This revision would include requirements from the building or fire codes or other nationally recognized standards that apply to fireworks storage buildings or redistribution activities, which are currently not included in Chapter 132D-2. Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The SFC and the HFD urge your committee's passage of H.B. 1664, H.D. 1.
