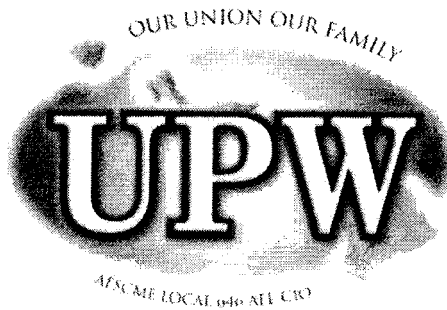

The UPW is the exclusive representative for approximately 14,000 public employees, which include blue collar, non-supervisory employees in Bargaining Unit 1 and institutional, health and correctional employees in Bargaining Unit 10, in the State of Hawaii and various counties. The UPW also represents about 1,500 members of the private sector.

The UPW strongly supports HB2051 HD1, which amends the criteria for the works of art to be commissioned to honor the late U.S. Senator Daniel K. Inouye and the late Representative Patsy T. Mink pursuant to Act 281, SLH 2013.
