Chair Ige, Vice Chair Kidani and Members of the Senate Committee on Ways and Means:

I am Major General Darryll D. M. Wong, Adjutant General and Director of State Civil Defense. I am testifying in **SUPPORT** of House Bill 2074.

This bill requests authorization to issue general obligation bonds to fund the State's share of the construction costs of a new long-term care facility. The federal government will appropriate their share of the facility's construction costs after the bond issue.

After construction, there will be no operational costs to the State. Currently, the State owns and licenses the Yukio Okutsu State Veteran's home in Hilo. The Hawaii Health Systems Corporation administers the facility under contract with the State. The new facility will operate in the same manner.

This new facility will mirror the success of the Okutsu facility built in 2004. It will be a step toward reducing the significant shortage of long-term care beds and services available to qualified veterans.

The Healthcare Association of Hawaii (HAH) is a 116-member organization that includes all of the acute care hospitals in Hawaii, the majority of long term care facilities, all the Medicare-certified home health agencies, all hospice programs, as well as other healthcare organizations including durable medical equipment, air and ground ambulance, blood bank and respiratory therapy. In addition to providing quality care to all of Hawaii's residents, our members contribute significantly to Hawaii's economy by employing nearly 20,000 people statewide.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of HB 2074, which would authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds for the construction of a second long-term care facility for veterans contingent upon the receipt of federal funds.

There are approximately one hundred twenty thousand veterans in Hawaii, forty-four thousand of whom are over the age of sixty-five. There is a serious shortfall of long-term care beds for veterans in the state, and the construction of a second long-term care facility would greatly expand access to quality long-term care for Hawaii's veterans.
