Comments: Dear Senators, On behalf of the Hawaii members of the National Rifle Association, I support House Bill 2246. This important legislation will ensure proper reporting of prohibited persons to NICS as well as provide an avenue for restoration of rights. I recommend the committee consider amending the bill to remove the initial two year prohibition on filing a petition for relief in addition to changing the standard for relief imposed on a petitioner from "clear and convincing evidence" to a "preponderance of the evidence". While this high standard is appropriate for the State to prove when taking away a right from a citizen, it is inappropriate to hold a citizen to this standard when seeking to restore a right.
