RELATING TO THRILL CRAFT OPERATION

Chair Tsuji, Vice Chair Ward, and Members of the Committee.

The Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism (DBEDT) supports HB2254 which proposes to make permanent an exemption to allow film production permit holders the ability to utilize thrill craft in non-designated areas as approved by the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR). DBEDT urges passage of this bill because Section 200-37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, which currently allows exemptions for filming, will sunset on June 30, 2014.

As a filming location, Hawaii has a global reputation for world renowned surf, pristine waters and the expert water safety professionals who support this industry. The use of jet skis for film shoots is normally limited to water safety usage, picture vessels, for transport of cast and crew members and for use as camera positioning. Per Act 89, SLH 2009, DBEDT has been providing the Legislature with yearly reports on Film Permits That Have Been Issued for the Use of Jet Skis. For FY10 – FY13 there were a total of 196 film permits issued for the use of jet skis over the past four (4) fiscal years. There were no complaints received by DLNR or the Hawaii Film Office for use of thrill crafts for film production, nor were there any incidents of environmental damage or business disruptions reported.

Given that there have been no incidents or environmental damage, and to maintain Hawaii's global reputation as a world class filming destination, DBEDT is in support of making this exemption permanent. Thank you for the opportunity to offer testimony on this measure.
