### Testimony of Linda Rosen, M.D., M.P.H Director of Health

#### March 12, 2014

- 1 **Department's Position:** The Department supports H.B. 2304, H.D. 2 relating to the Neurotrauma
- 2 Advisory Board.
- 3 **Fiscal Implications:** There are no fiscal implications.
- 4 **Purpose and Justification:** H.B. 2304, H.D. 2 proposes to amend HRS §321-3 to change the
- 5 minimum number of members on the Neurotrauma Advisory Board (NTAB) from 21 to 11 members
- as appointed by the Director of Health. The smaller number of members will allow the board to
- 7 have quorum on a regular basis improve the effectiveness of its statewide advisory board's capacity
- 8 to assist the Department to meet its legislative charge. More importantly, of the 11 members of the
- 9 Board, the composition of the Board will be made up of three (3) survivors or family members of
- individuals with neurotrauma appointed by the Director. This measure also proposes to delete
- representation from the Spinal Cord Injury Association as this association is no longer in operation.
- 12 A spinal cord injury survivor or family member will continue to be represented on the NTAB. The
- 13 Department has discussed this measure with the Board and they are in support of reducing the
- number of board members. Lastly, this measure will allow the Director to appoint up to three state
- and county ex officio non-voting members to the NTAB. Partnerships and collaboration with such
- entities will provide a more coordinated effort for NTAB initiatives.
