Chair Baker, Vice-Chair Taniguchi and Members of the Committee:

My name is Tim Dayton and I am General Manager for GEICO, Hawaii's largest insurer of motor vehicles. **GEICO opposes HB 2584 HD1** <u>in its current</u> form.

The original intent of the Bill was to control the costs in automobile insurance Personal Injury Protection (PIP) coverage by limiting charges for drugs, supplies, and materials billed under Personal Injury Protection benefits to levels corresponding to reimbursement by group health insurance. However, the language in HB 2584 HD1 does not accomplish the intent. As drafted, HD1 will allow a loophole for manufacturers to name their own price for drugs that are specifically designed to be dispensed to work comp injury and motor vehicle accident patients directly by physicians for windfall profit for both the physician and the manufacturer. GEICO strongly urges the Committee to adopt the language in SB2365 SD2 which will effectively address the loophole and accomplish the original intent of the legislation.
