Comments: The Hawaii Bicycling League, with 1,335 members and growing, strongly supports SB1007HD1. This bill continues Act 82, which requires the government to warn the public of dangerous natural conditions on improved public lands and by doing so, the governments (taxpayers) are not liable when people choose to take the risk of using such public lands. This bill also extends the duty to warn to dangerous nonnatural conditions (such as mountain climbing pins or marked trails) on unimproved public lands where the public is not being invited, but where use occurs nonetheless, again in exchange for nonliability of taxpayers when users choose to take the risks. This bill makes sense. Let the public make up its own mind to use or not use a place after seeing a warning. Most of the time that will result in great recreation, exercise, and use of the outdoors. In the infrequent times when injury occurs, that remains the risk of the individual. Mahalo for your support of this bill.

Dear Chair Luke and the Finance Committee,

We are writing as representatives of outdoor enthusiasts across a wide range of athletic activities to urge you to support and schedule SB 1007 before the Finance committee as soon as possible. This bill would provide much needed liability protection for the State from possible litigation stemming from hazardous recreational use of improved and unimproved public lands. While we as outdoor recreational users understand the risks we take to participate in our given sport, including hiking, mountain biking, rock climbing, paragliding, trail running, or hunting, this bill provides limited protection to the State in the event that an individual pursuing an activity on State land is injured or dies.

We presume that you are aware of the \$15 million dollar settlement awarded in 2012 during the Brem case on Kauai. While virtually no outdoor enthusiast involved in groups such as ours believes the State should have been assigned 100% liability, the existence of a legal system that can produce such an outcome indicates that we must have legislation in place that will balance the responsibility of those engaging in outdoor activities with the State's duty to warn of hazardous conditions. SB 1007 strikes this balance and gives the State protection while requiring the State to warn of known possible hazards. The costs of placing signs along trails throughout the State is a far more fiscally responsible method of dealing with these issues than being forced to pay yet another million dollar lawsuit.

Without a responsible change to our liability law in this area, local residents, native Hawaiians, and visitors may be fenced off and restricted from using natural, scenic and wildlife recreational areas because of liability concerns. The effect on our people's health and enjoyment of the outdoors will be severely reduced. The people in our organizations would rather see robust use of the outdoors and have the users exercise their experience, training, and judgment in dealing with nature, rather than shutting off access.

In contrast to the cost to the state for lawsuits, the cost of putting up signs is negligible and continues to require that the state embrace its duty to warn of hazardous conditions. It is also crucial to note that the state does not take on additional liability responsibility by extending SB 1007 to unimproved public lands or non-natural conditions – but instead this language is designed to recognize the numerous uses of state land for hazardous recreational purposes that cannot be confined to official state trails – whether that activity be for paragliding, hunting, seeking out a new swimming area, hiking or rock climbing.

We hope that our voices will demonstrate the groundswell of popular support for balanced liability law in Hawaii.

Thus, we urge you to schedule SB 1007 at your earliest convenience. Please contact us if you have any questions, otherwise we look forward to seeing SB1007 scheduled for a House Finance Committee hearing in the near future.

Comments: Dear Chair Luke and Finance Committee members, We are writing as representatives of outdoor enthusiasts across a wide range of athletic activities to urge you to pass SB 1007 before the Finance committee as soon as possible. This bill would provide much needed liability protection for the State from possible litigation stemming from hazardous recreational use of improved and unimproved public lands. While we as outdoor recreational users understand the risks we take to participate in our given sport, including hiking, mountain biking, rock climbing, paragliding, trail running, or hunting, this bill provides limited protection to the State in the event that an individual pursuing an activity on State land is injured or dies. We presume that you are aware of the \$15 million dollar settlement awarded in 2012 during the Brem case on Kauai. While virtually no outdoor enthusiast involved in groups such as ours believes the State should have been assigned 100% liability, the existence of a legal system that can produce such an outcome indicates that we must have legislation in place that will balance the responsibility of those engaging in outdoor activities with the State's duty to warn of hazardous conditions. SB 1007 strikes this balance and gives the State protection while requiring the State to warn of known possible hazards. The costs of placing signs along trails throughout the State is a far more fiscally responsible method of dealing with these issues than being forced to pay yet another million dollar lawsuit. Without a responsible change to our liability law in this area, local residents, native Hawaiians, and visitors may be fenced off and restricted from using natural, scenic and wildlife recreational areas because of liability concerns. The effect on our people's health and enjoyment of the outdoors will be severely reduced. The people in our organizations would rather see robust use of the outdoors and have the users exercise their experience, training, and judgment in dealing with nature, rather than shutting off access. In contrast to the cost to the state for lawsuits, the cost of putting up signs is negligible and continues to require that the state embrace its duty to warn of hazardous conditions. It is also crucial to note that the state does not take on additional liability responsibility by extending SB 1007 to unimproved public lands or non-natural conditions – but instead this language is designed to recognize the numerous uses of state land for hazardous recreational purposes that cannot be confined to official state trails – whether that activity be for paragliding, hunting, seeking out a new swimming area, hiking or rock climbing. We hope that our voices will demonstrate the groundswell of popular support for balanced liability law in Hawaii. Thus, we urge you to pass SB 1007 at your earliest convenience. 

I, Susan Donaldson the undersigned resident of Hawaii very strongly support the passage of SB1007, HD1 and any provisions that will make this legislation permanent.

I support this measure because I cherish my right to freely enjoy a wide variety of recreational activities in Hawaii's mountains including hiking, biking, trail running, climbing, paragliding and other activities. I am baffled by the State's current absence of liability protection, which has led to ongoing closures of climbing areas, hiking trails, and other scenic sites due to the State's legitimate fear of lawsuits. I strongly believe that public lands need to remain open to the public. It is patently absurd that the State should decide when, where, and how people are able to experience Hawaii's natural wonders – especially when such decisions are made largely based on liability risk assessments. It is time to take a significant step toward tort reform and shift our landowner liability paradigm toward something sensible, sustainable, and sane.

In comparison to other Western States, Hawaii's recreational liability statutes are sorely lacking. I do not want to see access to mountain sports across the Hawaiian Islands denied or restricted because the lobby for a small group of trial attorneys holds the rest of us hostage. I strongly disagree with previous testimony against liability reform in Hawaii that suggests that the status quo is in the best interest of the public, or that the status quo will keep us safer by holding the State liable for accidents (such as the Brem case in 2012). I am part of a responsible group of citizens who recognize the assumed risks in engaging in recreational activities on State lands. We believe that individuals who choose to go hiking, climbing, mountain biking, paragliding, or who choose to engage in any other recreational use of public lands, should do so at their own risk.

Without the passage of this bill, the State of Hawaii is left with very little protection from litigation resulting from injuries that occur on State lands. We believe the lack of liability protection is wholly untenable, especially given the ever-growing popularity of mountain recreation to residents in Hawaii and visitors comprising our tourist economy.

This bill is an agreeable compromise. It notably does not provide the State with absolute immunity, but does require that those engaging in hazardous recreational activities accept the risks associated with their actions. This bill will effectively balance State responsibilities (to maintain public trail systems and to warn of possible hazards) with the responsibilities of individuals to keep themselves safe and adequately prepared. Thus, we fully endorse this essential legislation and urge the Hawaii State Legislature to pass it into law.

Dear Representative Luke and Members of the Committee:

My name is Rob Turan and I would like to submit testimony in support of SB1007 HD1 PROPOSED which would update outdoor recreation (including rock climbing) liability protection for the State of Hawaii. I have been a National Park Service law enforcement Park Ranger and the Climbing Park Ranger for 30 years at National Parks including Grand Canyon, New River Gorge, Obed Wild and Scenic River, and Sunset Rock, Lookout Mountain, Tennessee. As the primary staff person dealing with all aspects of climbing management at these National Parks, from policy, anchor replacement, resource impact and mitigation, and search and rescue, my overall experience is without peer. In addition I have been an active rock climber since 1978. I helped institute the very first anchor replacement initiative to occur within federally managed land and this in turn set precedence for all other climbing parks to do the same to preserve rim ecosystems. I am the National Park Service's rock climbing rescue lead instructor. There are very few people who have more experience and expertise with rock climbing and crag management than I do and I provide this testimony on that basis.

I visited the North Shore of Oahu the spring of 2012, specifically to rock climb at the Mokuleia Crag, an incredible basalt/volcanic cliff that I had heard so much about from friends in the climbing community and in various magazine articles. I also bouldered at two other ocean-front areas on State land and these were spectacular also. In particular, I would like to point out that everything about the Mokuleia rock climbing crag, from the hike in, to the quality and texture of the smooth basalt, to the unique and safe top roping system, is of a world-class nature. I absolutely loved climbing at Mokuleia. I was very impressed that a cache was on site with safety equipment including a litter, helmets, rope and so forth. I have never seen such dedication placed into an area, nor such thorough attention to safety and on-site preparedness for a carry out operation in the event of an injury. The effort the Hawaii climbers have made to be safe is unparalleled in my extensive experience. In addition, the very well-maintained bolts and "string system" the local climbers have developed at the Mokuleia crag enables ropes, for top-roping, to be put into place from the ground, without any of the environmental damage and rockfall risk that often occurs along the top of climbing cliffs. Because of this system, climbers at the Mokuleia wall don't have to access the fragile environments

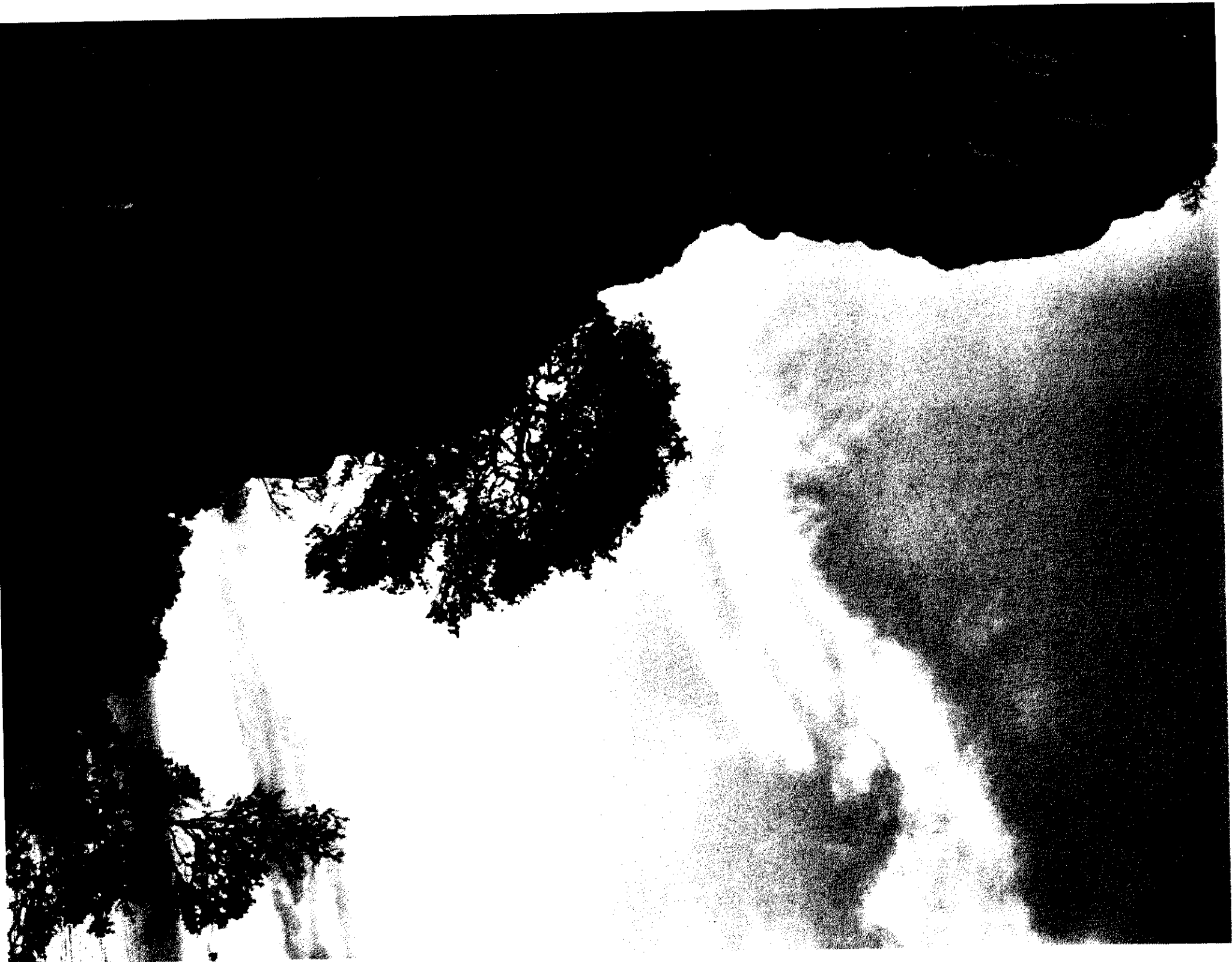
I am writing to ask you to **pass SB1007_HD1_PROPOSED**, to limit State liability related to rock climbing and other recreational activities on public lands. Two years ago, Governor Abercrombie's administration closed the world-class Mokuleia rock climbing area near my home on the North Shore of Oahu in addition to other climbing areas on unimproved State lands on Oahu due to liability concerns and it is my understanding that climbing would be permitted again at these areas if this bill is passed into law. Closed areas account for more than 80% of Hawaii's rock climbing sites. Before its closure, I spent almost every Sunday afternoon up at the Mokuleia rock climbing area with my local friends and, in the winter, with friends who used to visit from the mainland to climb here.

The Mokuleia crag is a world-class climbing area (photograph of my friends climbing there attached). The rock is high-quality, the system for setting up top roping equipment is ideal for me (because I'm not a strong lead climber and I don't like climbing where I might fall onto the ground, even if it's padded), and the hike up to the crag is beautiful and nicely maintained. It is very important to me, for many reasons, that I not go another year without climbing at Mokuleia – it is the only suitable place for me to climb. I can't afford the time off from work or the expense of traveling to the mainland to climb. The hike to the crag was good for my physical fitness and the leisure time spent with friends was good for me in general. I really miss it. I recognize the assumed risks in engaging in outdoor recreational activities. The greatest risk at Mokuleia is not from climbing, but from the rare event when someone walks above the cliff: No one should top out and access areas above the top anchor bolts – doing so would mean walking on areas where there may be loose rock – doing so would damage the vegetation. Topping out or walking above the top anchors on the crag should be illegal – not rock climbing on the face of the cliff.

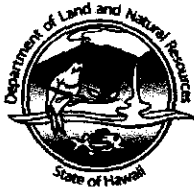

Senate Bill (SB) 1007, Senate Draft (SD) 2, House Draft (HD) 1, proposes to eliminate the sunset date on Act 82 liability protection associated with warning signs for outdoor recreation on public lands. **The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports SB1007 SD2 HD 1 and making Act 82 permanent to codify critically needed legal protection.**

The following language is the only recommended amendment to Act 82:

“A sign or signs warning of dangerous natural conditions on improved public lands or of dangerous non-natural conditions on unimproved public lands shall be conclusively presumed to be legally adequate warning of the dangerous [natural] conditions of which the sign or signs warn, if the State or a county posts a sign or signs warning of the dangerous [natural] conditions and the design and placement of the warning sign or signs are approved by the board”.

This small, specific revision to the original Act 82 language would allow for warning signs to be effective in specific areas of Department land on Oahu where activities such as established, non-commercial recreational rock climbing occurs. This specific revision was crafted by the Attorney General in collaboration with House Judiciary and has generated the support of over 2,000 members of the public who engage in a variety of outdoor recreational pursuits.

Act 82, was passed in Session Laws of Hawaii 2003, in the ensuing 11 years the Department has initiated a comprehensive sign program that is deployed statewide in public recreational areas associated with parks and wilderness trails. These actions have resulted in a variety of critical outcomes and now institutionalized management practices that did not exist prior to the passage of Act 82:

1. The public now has become accustomed to seeing clear, uniform, standard signs warning of potential exposure to hazardous natural conditions at managed trailheads and park entrances and at the actual point of exposure - across the State of Hawaii.
 2. This sign program strikes the balance between the government's duty to warn and the public's responsibility to heed that warning and then make an informed choice before engaging in recreational activity.
 3. Due to the proliferation of recreational use partially associated with social media, there must be a reasonable balance between informed public use and prevention of unwarranted liability. Absent this, a result may be either having to close more Department recreational areas or expend vast amounts of public funds to attempt to mitigate natural conditions that are beyond the scope of any funding and mitigation - and that ultimately would be detrimental to the integrity of Hawaii's natural resources.
 4. There is overwhelming public support of passage of this legislation, **with only one opposing testimony at previous hearings**. It is time to now make this warning management protocol a permanent law.

Again, the Department is in strong support of making this Act permanent and adding the aforementioned amendment that is in SB 1007HD1.
