## **RE:** SENATE BILL 2004 RELATING TO HOME CARE LICENSING

Chair Ige and Vice Chair Kidani, and Members of the Committee:

The Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii ("The Chamber") **supports** SB 2004 Relating to Home Care Licensing.
