## Testimony of Gary Gill Acting Director of Health

- 1 Department's Position: The Department of Health supports this bill provided that its passage does
- 2 not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in our Executive Budget.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: Unspecified
- 4 Purpose and Justification: The Department of Health appreciates the intent of this bill, but must point
- out that the operation of the Deposit Beverage Container (DBC) Program is not presently in danger of
- 6 ceasing operations.
- 7 Last year, projections showed that the program would be insolvent by the current fiscal year.
- 8 The situation arose from a combination of factors including fund transfers, the loss of the Program's
- 9 Central Services Fee (SCF) exemption, and the loss of interest revenue. Collectively, we estimate the
- impact of these actions at approximately \$15.8 million from FY 2009-10 through FY 2012-13.
- The restoration of the CSF exemption during last year's legislative session has restored \$2.5
- million to \$3 million annually; enough to stabilize the Program's incoming revenue stream and stop the
- erosion of the Program's fund balance.
