The Liquor Commission, City and County of Honolulu, supports Senate Bill 2258, Relating to the Penal Code.

Like the other public safety individuals identified in Section 707-711(i), Hawaii Revised Statutes, the proposed measure will characterize the knowing or intentional infliction of bodily injury to a liquor control investigator engaged in the performance of duty as assault in the second degree. The environment in which our liquor control investigators work is as potentially hazardous as that occupied by firefighters and water safety officers.
