Testimony in Support of SB 2265 <u>Relating to Housing</u> Submitted by Robert Hirokawa, Chief Executive Officer January 25, 2014, 10:00 am, Room 229

The Hawaii Primary Care Association (HPCA), which represents the federally qualified community health centers in Hawaii, supports Senate Bill 2265, making an appropriation to improve existing public housing.

The HPCA is a staunch believer in the social determinants of health, those economic and social conditions that influence an individual and a community's health status. These conditions serve as risk factors endemic to a person's living and working environment, rather than their behavioral or genetic histories. Factors such as income, education, access to recreation and healthy foods, housing, and employment, can and do have measurable impacts on a person and a community, both in health and financial outcomes.

Senate Bill 2265 speaks to one of these major determinants by appropriating funds to improve existing public housing. For that reason, we strongly support this measure and thank you for the opportunity to testify.
