(3) Establish statewide qualifications, testing, and certification, and credentialing that conforms with based on the adopted state fire code and nationally recognized standards, for individuals that conduct maintenance testing of fire extinguishers and fire protection and fire alarm systems; provided that certification fees shall be determined by the county fire departments;

It also seeks to authorize the SFC to implement statewide memoranda of understanding and agreements for the effective utilization of fire and life safety resources for natural and manmade disasters and emergencies.
