The Department of Public Safety (PSD) is in **support** of Senate Bill 2308,

Relating to Children. The Department supports providing social services and programs for the children who have a parent(s) in the prison system.

Currently, PSD contracts with qualified private vendors to provide individual and family therapy sessions to male and female inmates with substance abuse issues, who are preparing to transition to the community after a lengthy period of incarceration. The program attempts to address family core issues, prior to the inmate's placement on furlough.

The Hawai'i Primary Care Association, which represents community health centers in Hawai'i, **supports** Senate Bill 2308 which provides \$250,000 for programs and services for children of incarcerated parents and assisting with family reunification.

The HPCA is a staunch believer in the social determinants of health, those economic and social conditions that influence an individual and a community's health status. These conditions serve as risk factors endemic to a person's living and working environment. Factors such as income, education, access to recreation and healthy foods, housing, and employment, can and do have measurable impacts on a person and a community, both in health and financial outcomes.
