Chair Ige, Vice Chair Kidani, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Public Safety (PSD) is in **support** of SB 2308, Relating to Children. The Department supports providing social services and programs for the children who have a parent(s) in the prison system.

It is well established that children of incarcerated parents are far more likely than other children to eventually become enmeshed in the criminal justice system. National research shows that they are seven times more likely to become incarcerated as adults. If for that alone, we need to do much more for these children. In addition, however, programs which promote family reunification improve the offender's chances for a successful parole, and improve behavior while in prison. We know that such programs are viable, and we do have some strong local models, such as Supporting Keiki of Incarcerated Parents (SKIP) and the Fathers Bridging the Miles programs.

We recognize that we need to expand on our limited program offerings for inmates with children. Currently, our programs are limited to contracts with qualified private vendors to provide individual and family therapy sessions to male and female inmates with substance abuse issues, who are preparing to transition to the community after a lengthy period of incarceration. The program attempts to address family core issues, prior to the inmate's placement on furlough, and build a support system to benefit both inmate and child(ren).

SB 2308 will provide PSD the opportunity to expand these types of programs to all willing inmates with children. We support this bill.

TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF SB 2308 RELATING TO CHILDREN

Hawaii Youth Services Network (HYSN), a statewide coalition of youth-serving organizations, supports SB 2308 Relating to Children.

Children of incarcerated parents experience grief and loss, similar to the experience of divorce or the death of a parent. Studies show that children of incarcerated parents are at increased risk of abuse or neglect, and more likely to have mental problems, and difficulty in school. Children of incarcerated parents are seven times more likely to enter the juvenile or adult correctional systems themselves. Providing opportunities to sustain the parent-child bond can alleviate many of these problems.

Prisoners who have regular contact with their children benefit as well. They are less likely to violate prison rules and create trouble for prison authorities. They are more likely to take advantage of rehabilitation and educational opportunities while in prison. Regular contact with children increases the chances of successful reintegration into the community when a parent is released from prison.

Hawaii Youth Services Network believes that children and their incarcerated parents will benefit from parent/child support programs in Hawaii's prisons.
