Chair Ige, Vice-Chair Kidani and members of the Senate Committee on Ways and Means, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the City and County of Honolulu submits the following comments on Senate Bill 2309, Senate Draft 1.

S.B. 2309, S.D. 1, makes an appropriation to the Department of Public Safety for the establishment and implementation of a re-entry facility for criminal offenders, which will include residential and day reporting programs.

While the Department supports the funding of re-entry programs for offenders transitioning back into society, we strongly believe that some of the \$100 million appropriated in this bill should be used for the building and operation of a new two-thousand to three-thousand bed correctional facility designed to house medium-security inmates. This would help to keep local offenders at facilities in-state, closer to family, friends, and programs that are sensitive to the needs those who grew up in Hawai'i.
