

TESTIMONY BY KALBERT K. YOUNG DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND FINANCE STATE OF HAWAII TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS ON SENATE BILL NO. 2497, S.D. 1

February 13, 2014

RELATING TO TOBACCO REGULATION

Senate Bill No. 2497, S.D. 1, increases the tobacco license fee pursuant to Section 245-2, HRS, from \$2.50 to \$250.00, and increases the retail tobacco permit fee pursuant to Section 245-2.5, HRS, from \$20.00 to \$50.00. The bill also specifies that revenues from the license and permit fees shall be used to support smoking cessation programs in the State.

The Department of Budget and Finance defers to the Departments of Health and Taxation regarding the programmatic and revenue impacts of the bill; however, we would like to point out that the tobacco license and permit fees are currently deposited into the general fund. As a matter of general policy, we do not support earmarking of general fund revenues. The requirement that "revenues . . . shall be used to support smoking cessation programs in the State," cannot be implemented by the Administration without a specific Legislative appropriation of general funds for a specified fiscal year to be expended by a State department.

- Department's Position: The Department of Health (DOH) offers comments and defers to the
- 2 Department of Taxation (DoTax) on those matters relating to fees and revenue implementation.
- Fiscal Implications: The DOH defers to the DoTax on the fiscal implications.
- 4 **Purpose and Justification:** SB2497,SD1 proposes to increase the current annual license fee for
- tobacco wholesalers and dealers from \$2.50 to \$250.00 and also increase the annual tobacco retail
- 6 permit fee from \$20.00 to \$50.00. The amended SD1 specifies that revenue from license and permit
- 7 fees shall be used to support smoking cessation programs in the State.
- The DOH supports the significant increase in licensure and permitting fees which have remained
- 9 unchanged for many years despite high tobacco taxes and ever increasing tobacco industry expenditures
- in marketing and advertising. Tobacco licensing is an effective tool for limiting the negative public
- health consequences of tobacco use by identifying who sells tobacco and better ensuring that licensees
- adhere to responsible business practices under Chapters 245-2 and 245-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes
- 13 (HRS).
- This measure proposes that the revenues collected shall be used to support smoking cessation
- programs in the State. However, the measure does not include an appropriation section to establish a Promoting Lifelong Health & Wellness

- special fund for that purpose. The DOH defers to the priorities of the Governor's Supplemental
- 2 Executive Budget requests on any additional funds for public health programs. Currently the revenue
- from the fees goes to the general fund. The DoTax is responsible for administering the licensing and
- 4 permitting of tobacco wholesalers or dealers and retailers. The DOH would be supportive of directing
- 5 the revenues to support increasing the capacity for the administration, surveillance, and enforcement of
- 6 tobacco products regulations.
