Chair English and Honorable Committee Members:

My name is Peter Fithian and I represent the Airport Concessionaires

Committee. The Committee represents the majority of the concessions at Hawaii's public airports.

With minor amendment, the Committee supports this bill for a 6 month extension of Act 46 passed by the 2012 Legislature. More time is needed to review proposals and plans and gain necessary approvals at the discretion of Hawaii's DOT.

As to the amendment, we request that the word "lease" be removed from line 5 on page 2 of the bill since such negotiations may involve not only leases but also permits in accordance with Act 46.

At the sole discretion of Hawaii's DOT, the program allows the DOT and individual airport concessions to continue to proceed with fast-tracking construction of 80,000 or more feet of concession space and/or improvements needed at Hawaii's public airports.

A DOT Airports study not only documented the immediate need for more space but also the additional and immediate revenues the DOT Airports division would generate from concession improvements when completed.

While the goal to enhance DOT revenues is important, this program per Act 46 recognizes hardships and extra costs such fast-tracking will result to various concessions due to barricades, noise, re-routing of passengers and possible temporary re-location of concession space. Further, various concessions with short-term leases and/or permits would object to

such improvements since the remaining term on their lease/permit does not allow them to spend monies and amortize the costs of improving existing space and/or newly built space.

To help solve these difficulties, to meet the goal to fast tracking improvements and to gain additional airport revenues sooner than later, this program allows the DOT at its sole discretion to work with airport concessions, and in exchange for expenses paid and improvements made by concessions, the DOT at its sole discretion may modify and extend the term of concession leases and permits to address such concerns and hardships faced by the concessions.

Various concessions are still proceeding to meet and complete discussions with the DOT Airports divisions. The 6 month extension of Act 46 should allow for the completion of such discussions.

We respectfully urge you to pass this bill with minor amendment to conform with Act 46. As in the past, your continued support of this program is appreciated. Thank you.


