I am Keone Kali, Deputy Chief Information Officer (Operations), in the State Office of Information Management and Technology (OIMT), speaking in strong support of S.B. No. 2981 which amends the state plan policies, objectives, and priority guidelines concerning the economy and information technology.

As part of State government's 10-year, multi-phased plan to transform how it does business, OIMT has the lead role to improve the reliability, availability, and capabilities of the State's data processing and communications infrastructure supporting departments across all islands. Reaching that objective requires significant expansion of the broadband communication infrastructure which connects this island state to its neighbors around the Pacific Rim.
