Chairs Espero, Solomon, and Ige, and Members of the Committees:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written comments on S.B. No. 3003, S.D. 1.

The bill proposes to establish the County of Niihau and place the County of Niihau under the jurisdiction of the Department of Land and Natural Resources.

The title of this bill does not appear to conform to the constitutional requirement of article III, section 14, Hawaii State Constitution, which provides, "Each law shall embrace but one subject, which shall be expressed in its title." If an act does not comply with article III, section 14, the act will be rendered invalid if challenged. See, Schwab v. Ariyoshi, 58 Haw. 25, 31, 564 P.2d 135, 139 (1977) ("Article III, Section 15 of the Hawaii State Constitution [predecessor to the current article III, section 14] is mandatory and a violation thereof would render an enactment nugatory"). The bill is entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to Land." However, the bill is about the creation of the County of Niihau, which is a matter of political governance, not land.

We respectfully suggest that if the Committee wishes to go forward with this bill, that the more appropriate vehicle would be S.B. No. 172, S.D. 1, which has the title "A Bill for an Act Relating to Counties."
