SB 3012 — Relating to Medical Records

The Healthcare Association of Hawaii (HAH) is a 116 member organization that includes all of the acute care hospitals in Hawaii, the majority of long term care facilities, all the Medicare-certified home health agencies, all hospice programs, as well as other healthcare organizations including durable medical equipment, air and ground ambulance, blood bank and respiratory therapy. In addition to providing quality care to all of Hawaii's residents, our members contribute significantly to Hawaii's economy by employing nearly 20,000 people statewide.

Thank you for this opportunity to testify in opposition to SB 3012, which would require healthcare providers to provide medical records free of charge for purposes of claims or appeals related to a proceeding under any provision of the Social Security Act or for state assistance under the aged, blind, and disabled program.

Healthcare providers are committed to providing timely production of patients' medical records. Supplying a patient with this type of information is not just a matter of accessing a file inside a hospital. Because of the sensitivity and complexity of the information, healthcare providers use the assistance of medical records vendors to manage medical records. SB 3012 would require hospitals to produce these records which, due to the third party relationship, could lead to increased administrative and vendor costs which would then have to be passed along to patients. HAH respectfully asks that SB 3012 be deferred at this time to allow HAH and its members to submit amendments to the measure that would better assist healthcare providers and vendors in the production of sensitive patient medical records.
