# In consideration of SENATE BILL 3090 RELATING TO HUNTING

Senate Bill 3090 proposes to make an appropriation to implement a Hunter Education Program and develop shooting ranges. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports the intent of this bill provided that its passage does not adversely impact other budget priorities and offers the following comments:

The Department has an established Hunter Education Program that is responsible for providing a standardized hunter education curriculum throughout the State of Hawaii. At present, funding for the program comes exclusively from Federal Special Funds through the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Conservation Act, and these funds are used for program costs including lease rent, common area maintenance for program offices, utility costs, training materials and manuals and ground and air transportation. Special funds are also used toward shooting range development projects already in progress throughout the State.
