My name is Stanley H Roehrig. I am a local boy lawyer living in Hilo. I was raised in Manoa and moved with my young wife to Hilo in 1966 to practice law. Most of our 48 years in Hilo have been in Keaukaha.

My wife and I have been involved with Keahi Warfield, Ka'iu Kimura, and many others in the development of the after school program for disadvantaged Hawaiian children in the Hilo area, called the RISE After School Program.

In the last session of this legislature, the legislature adopted both SCR132 and SR94, requesting the University of Hawaii at Hilo to implement the RISE Program. University of Hawaii at Hilo Chancellor Straney signed a Memorandum of Understanding implementing the program. See Exhibit "A" attached. The program is being administered as an outreach program of UH Hilo Imiloa Astronomy Center and the Division of Academic Affairs.

Through the vehicle of SB3093, the University of Hawaii at Hilo and the RISE 21st Century After School Program seek funding from the legislature for fiscal year 2014.

We believe that this program, initially based in Hilo, will be a prototype for an important statewide after school program in all areas of the state where the Hawaiian communities and their families are at risk.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I AT HILO AND RISE 21st Century After School Program

The University of Hawal'i at Hilo and RISE 21st Century After School Program agree to cooperate via this memorandum of understanding to provide a bridge between the University of Hawali at Hilo campus and the communities of Keaukaha and Pana'ewa for the purpose of creating mentorship opportunities, project based learning activities, and also peer mentoring opportunities for the youth of the RISE program.

This agreement provides for a collaborative partnership in the belief that the agreement will increase mutual interest in higher education promotion and workforce development for healthy communities.

- UH Hilo ('Imilioa Astronomy Center and the division of Academic Affairs) and RISE agree to the following activities based on their respective missions and educational needs and objectives:
 - UHH will provide mentoring for encouragement, motivation, and self esteem and to increase knowledge of future career and academic paths;
 - b. UHH and RISE shall collaborate on funding initiatives to support collaborative goals and objectives;
 - UHH and RISE will collaboratively develop and offer project based activities that foster and encourage peer mentoring while addressing relevant community initiatives.
- The implementation of this agreement shall be separately negotiated and determined by both 'Imilian and RISE, Efforts shall be made by both sides to find financial sources for carrying out the objectives listed above.
- This agreement is in force for two (2) years and is subject to revision or modification by mutual agreement. It is also understood that either parly may terminate the agreement at any time.
- This agreement is effective when the representatives of both parties have affixed their signatures and seal to the agreement
