SB0651, RELATING TO HEALTH

Testimony of David Sakamoto, MD, MBA Deputy Director, Health Resources Administration

- 1 Department's Position: The Department of Health (DOH) supports the intent of SB0651 which
- 2 prohibits smoking in and around public housing under the jurisdiction of the Hawaii Public Housing
- 3 Authority (HPHA). DOH agrees with the purpose of this measure to protect residents of public housing
- 4 by banning smoking in public housing projects. DOH offers suggestions to the language regarding
- 5 designated smoking areas.
- 6 Fiscal Implications: None.
- 7 Purpose and Justification: This measure amends Chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes to prohibit
- 8 smoking in any public housing project or state low-income housing project. It requires designation of
- one or more permissible smoking areas not less than twenty feet from any residential building or
- community facility. In Section 356D(a) the DOH recommends adding item, "(5) parking lots; and" (see
- lines 4 to 12). Additionally, we suggest replacing the word, "shall" with "may in subsection (b) (see line
- 12 13) to allow the HPHA the flexibility to provide the designated smoking areas.
- Regarding the purpose of this measure, DOH recognizes the scientific findings and
- 14 recommendations of the United States Surgeon General regarding the hazards of involuntary exposure to
- secondhand smoke (SHS) by nonsmokers. Those findings disclose that: 1) There is no safe level or Promoting Lifelong Health & Wellness

- amount of exposure to SHS, and breathing even a little amount can be dangerous; 2) Children are more
- 2 likely to have lung problems, ear infections, and severe asthma from being around tobacco smoke;
- 3 3) Breathing SHS is a known cause of sudden infant death syndrome; 4) SHS is a known human
- 4 carcinogen (cancer-causing agent); and 5) Inhaling SHS causes lung cancer, coronary heart disease, and
- 5 strokes in nonsmoking adults.
- 6 Hawaii's current smoke-free workplace and public places law, Chapter 328J enacted in 2006,
- 7 protects the public in enclosed and partially-enclosed areas, but does not cover private residences. The
- 8 federal Housing and Urban Development Authority actively supports and encourages the creation of
- 9 smoke-free residential public housing properties governed under that authority.
- DOH supports the intent of this bill to improve the living conditions of the residents of public
- housing projects and state low-income housing projects by prohibiting smoking, and will continue to
- 12 collaborate with the HPHA in its implementation of smoking cessation efforts.
